THE PATTERN OF BEING

November is a time in which we are called to remember many things. *All Souls* is a feast in the Church, otherwise known as The *Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed*. It is a time to remember those who have died in wartime in the service of their country. It is also when we are invited to remember past events, such as the Gunpowder Plot (Remember, Remember...). What belies the mystery of what it means to remember? I believe it is a few things. 1) To remind ourselves that we are not our own history, that our life is rooted in an immense age. That we are therefore of a great age, not just isolated in our time from what has come before. 2) That history is a witness of our own failure, which points to us as a reminder, a warning. 3) That in forgetting we lose our sense of self, our place in time.

In my lifetime a great fog has enveloped us which blinds us from seeing our lives as connected to those who have gone before us. For example, the free-love movement of the 60's promised to change the world. The new age (Aquarius?) heralded a new time in which the past was dead and gone and we were it. Those who know history find this notion in Revolutionary France (1789). A mindset of historical dissociation—it is still with us. The truth is, that humanity has not departed from the essential pattern of its being (what it means to be human). Humanity is the same as it was yesterday, as it is today, as it will be until its natural end. To remember is an act of re-connection, to re-associate ourselves with the history of what it means to be a human being, frail, fragile and immensely fallible. The wars of the past speak to us of the pitfalls of wars today. The wisdom of the past has much to teach us. As the great Plato said: 'only the dead have seen the end of war'. We must look back to our teachers and listen and act. The pattern of our being requires constraint and correction, which needs to be underpinned with understanding and loving mercy.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

“Heather’s Chicken Dish”

Ingredients

(Taken from the Parish Recipe Book)

- 1 Cooked chicken
- 1 Tin of Peach Slices
- ½ lb Mushrooms – sliced and 2 minutes in the Microwave
- 1 Tin Sweetcorn
- 1 Pint white sauce
- Plain Crisps
- Cheese

Method

- Place chicken meat in pieces in shallow casserole dish.
- Add peaches sliced, sweetcorn and mushrooms and mix well.
- Add one pint of white sauce and mix in.
- Grate cheese on top and sprinkle with crushed crisps.
- Cook at 160°C for 1 ½ hours.

This dish is very accommodating for late guests and is delicious served with green salad and French bread.
Quantities of ingredients are not at all critical.





GARDENERS NEWS

“The delightful Apple Tree”

Before the war, there were over fifty types of apple readily available for the consumer to buy; today we have a tiny number of largely unexciting commercial varieties to choose from.

Unfortunately, the priorities for a commercial apple grower (dictated by supermarket buyers) are not necessarily those of the consumer. The consumer values flavour, but the commercial world instead needs heavy crops, large, regular shaped fruit, resistance to bruising, storage for many months and an attractive look.

The solution is to get a better apple by growing your own. This will certainly involve discovering the less commercial alternatives to the ubiquitous Cox's Orange, Bramley or Golden Delicious but will be well worthwhile.

First decide what you want your apple to do for you: no disease or spraying? Try 'Bardsey' or 'Red Windsor'. Dual purpose cooker and eater? Try the tasty 'Cobra'. A truly traditional eating apple? Try 'Chivers Delight' or 'Pitmaston Pineapple'. Local? The cooker 'Tillington Court'.

Apples make superb garden trees because an apple tree's height and vigour is controlled by the rootstock it is propagated onto. This means that a small garden can accommodate a 6 ft (1.8m) tree on an M 27 very dwarf rootstock, whilst those with more space can grow the same apple in a larger tree size on a more vigorous rootstock like M.9 (about 12 feet) or MM. 109 (about 20 feet).

The biggest range of apple trees is available this month. For great advice, I always talk to the apple tree experts at Frank P. Matthews 'Tree Shop' retail outlet at Tenbury Wells and check their catalogue information. (See (www.frankmatthews.com then 'Tree Shop').

Here's a pre-wassail toast to **REAL** apples!
