PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

YOUR PARISH NEEDS YOU!



As Burghill Parish Council, much of what we do is attending to the minor things that can make a difference to the people in our parish and environment. We tackle issues such as speeding, pollution, pavements, potholes, footpaths and the like. We are also consulted on all planning applications within the parish.

The Parish Council currently meets every month and at present has three vacancies. If you are interested in becoming a parish councillor and want to play a part in our changing community, please contact our parish clerk, Paulette Scholes, on Telephone number 07801 958673 or email: clerk@burghillparishcouncil.org

The position is unpaid and voluntary, but some expenses such as training are paid by the Parish Council.

OCTOBER

Burghill Parish Council held its monthly meeting, via Zoom, on Tuesday 13th October.

Nine Councillors were present along with the Parish Clerk, Ward Councillor Pauline Crockett, and one member of the public.

The Parish Council discussed four planning applications:

- Planning application 202640 - Penberry Cottage, Burghill, Hereford, HR4 7RE. Application to raise the roof of existing side extension and addition of a small window dormer to the rear to resolve internal head height issues. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application.
- Planning application 202975 - Taupo Cottage, Burghill, Hereford, HR4 7RW. Proposed single-storey rear extension and porch to

the side. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application.

- Planning Application 202881 - Wellington Lane Cottage, Canon Pyon, Hereford, HR4 8NL. Proposed first floor extension to the rear. Conversion of existing garage to family room. New front porch and dormers to the front of the property as well as new access, driveway and new garage. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application but noted and supported the comments made by the Transportation Department at Herefordshire Council.
- Planning re-consultation 162920 - Land at Three Elms, Hereford. The Parish Council accepts that the proposed Three Elms project west of Hereford City is included in the Herefordshire Local Plan (Core Strategy 2011-2031) as a development strategy. However, it still has concerns regarding the ability of highway infrastructure, and the ability of the local drainage and sewerage systems to cope with this development.

Our Finance and Administration Working Group met and discussed the requirement for a new Parish website and all the small grant requests. A Small Grants Policy was discussed and adopted by the Parish Council. The precept figure was considered and will be discussed by the full council at the next meeting in November.

Our Community and Environment Working Group continues to work on a number of projects including management of the commons, which includes its maintenance of the footpath, pruning of the trees and flooding of the ditch. Road safety and the use of 'Section 106' monies including a bus shelter and kerbs at Leasown and the planting of new trees at Leasown.

It was agreed to install three Community Defibrillators in the Parish, one in Tillington, one by the Shop in Tillington and one in St Marys Park. There is already one at the Golf Club, so there will be four around the parish.

Our next planned meeting is Tuesday 10th November 2020, these will continue to be via Zoom. We are still taking advice on how the Parish Council should operate in these uncertain times.

NOVEMBER

Burghill Parish Council held its monthly meeting, via Zoom, on Tuesday 10th November.

Ten Councillors were present along with the Parish Clerk and Ward Councillor Pauline Crockett, there were no members of the public present.

The Parish Council discussed three planning applications:

- Planning application 203250 - Burlton Villa, Roman Road, Hereford, HR4 9QN. Demolition of existing extension and outbuildings, replacement with a single storey extension. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application but did comment on the design which may divide opinion.
- Planning application 203591 - Land adjacent to Bredstone House, Burghill, Hereford. Proposed removal of condition 15 of planning permission 194343. The applicant asked that the condition which removed permitted development rights be deleted. The Parish Council noted that local Neighbourhood Development Plan's Design Guidance states "permitted development rights for outbuildings, extensions, additions and conservatories shall be withdrawn on sites for new housing". It was agreed that Herefordshire Council would be reminded of this position.
- Planning Application 203473 - Wetland Plants, Tillington, Hereford, HR4 8LH. Proposed extension to ex packing/potting shed. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application but noted concerns for the neighbours and their amenity with the increase and timing of vehicles accessing the site.

Our Finance and Administration Working Group confirmed the number of small grants that have been approved and the precept figure was considered and agreed for 2021/2022 at £20,245 which is a 1.35% increase, the first increase for four years.

Our Community and Environment Working Group continues to work on a number of projects including management of the commons, pruning of the trees and flooding of the ditch. Road safety and the use of 'Section 106' monies including a bus shelter and kerbs at Leasown and are now looking at updating the current parish council website.

One of the three Community Defibrillators have been installed at Simpson Hall, the other two will be installed shortly. The Parish Council agreed to accept a generous donation from GPT Properties (David Thomas and Mark Ellis) which covers most of the costs involved.

The meeting dates for 2021 were agreed and will go on the website. The footpath at Red House Farm was discussed, Balfour Beatty will be contacted as to the best way to resolve this current issue of the entrance to the footpath down the current slope.

Our next planned meeting is Tuesday 12th January 2021, these will continue to be via Zoom. We are still taking advice on how the Parish Council should operate in these uncertain times.

Possible First Time Sewerage for Areas of the Burghill Parish

Parishioners will recall the flyer distributed to houses in the Tillington & Tillington Common area in 2018 regarding the possibility of Welsh Water providing public sewerage for this area of the parish. At that time the response from parishioners was varied, ranging from very positive views on the benefits, to negative opinions that such a scheme could attract more development to the locality. Unfortunately, the pollution problems persist, with the unpleasant traces of foul sewage in the drainage ditches in the Tillington area. The presence of foul sewage in these open ditches is both a public health hazard and endangers the natural ecology and fauna of the region with further harmful effects downstream within the catchments of the Rivers Lugg and Wye.

Recently, our County Councillor together with other residents, has been doing a house-to-house survey to ascertain local opinions on the provision of a sewerage project in this area of the parish. The response has demonstrated that 36 households, representing 92 residents, would be in favour of the Parish Council making an approach to Welsh Water to move things along.

Before the Parish Council takes this any further it needs to know the wider views of the parish as to the level of interest in these possible steps to improve our environment for everyone. It should be emphasised that the provision of a new sewer does not impose an obligation for householders to connect to any new system. However, the longer-term benefits for both the environment and property values should not be set aside easily.

A TINY WORD IN YOUR EAR

God or Nature -- two big words with a tiny word in between. But which one are we talking about?

The word *or* might be taken here in its disjunctive sense: either God or Nature, one or the other. Sadly, we are still living in a world where fanaticism can erupt at any moment. Amazing how dangerous the 'game' of language can be – and amazing how much depends on the tiny word *or*!

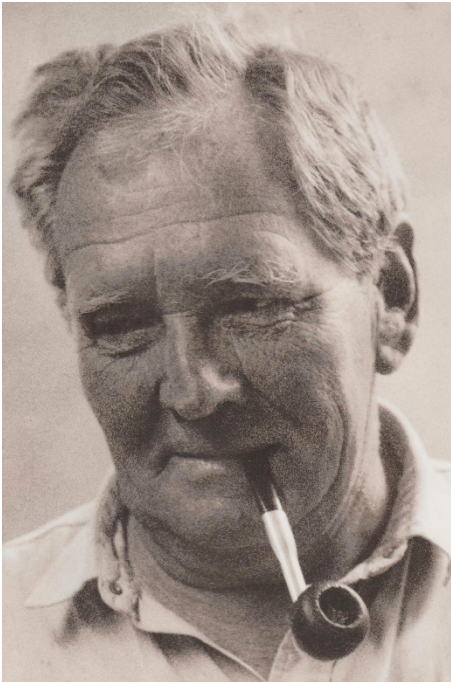

GARDENERS NEWS

“Growing a Hedge”

Hedges have many advantages over fencing: they don't tend to blow over in strong winds for instance, nor do they make your garden look as if it is confined within a wooden box. They are also a transport system and nesting place for wildlife, often attractive with flowers and fruits and intruder deterrent if you choose a spiky type of plant. A huge range of shrubs can be used for hedging although in practice the most popular hedging plants are those which can be bought comparatively cheaply, or, now in the winter season, 'bareroot' - bundled without the costly luxury of individual pots. Provided the ground is not waterlogged or frozen, this month is a good time to plant a hedge. The speed of growth of a hedge is greatly dependent on the preparation of the planting site as well as aftercare (feeding and watering until it is fully established) so shortcuts now will haunt you for years to come.

Start by digging a trench for your hedge line, as wide as you would like your hedge. Hedging plants may either be planted in a single row, or, if a really thick hedge is required more quickly and the plants are slender, in a double zig zag row. Fill the trench with a mixture of the original soil plus compost and/or well-rotted manure and plant into this. A little extra bonemeal or mycorrhizal fungus compound will encourage early root establishment. Check the correct planting distances for your specific hedging plants: most hedging plants tend to need spacing at 2 - 2 1/2 feet apart (60-75cms) but more vigorous plants such as conifers need wider intervals of about 3 feet (90 cms) because if they are too closely planted, some will be suffocated later by their neighbours and die off.

Keep the new hedge watered throughout this coming summer (a simple garden irrigation system is best) and keep any competing weeds from around its base. If you have planted the hedge in conjunction with a chain-link fence, be prepared to remove the fence as the hedge takes over the boundary role as wire can both damage hedge trimmers and cut into trunks and branches.

When it becomes old enough to trim, always cut the hedge into a wedge shape with the base wider than the top. This professional tip will ensure that your hedge never goes bare at the bottom, doesn't collapse or flop, and suffocates any weeds which might try and compete with it.

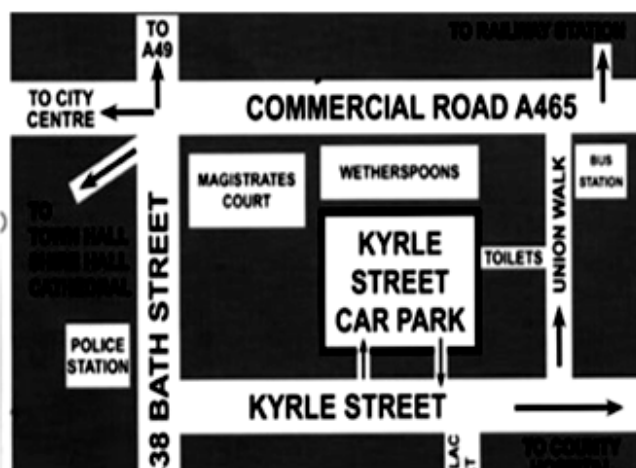

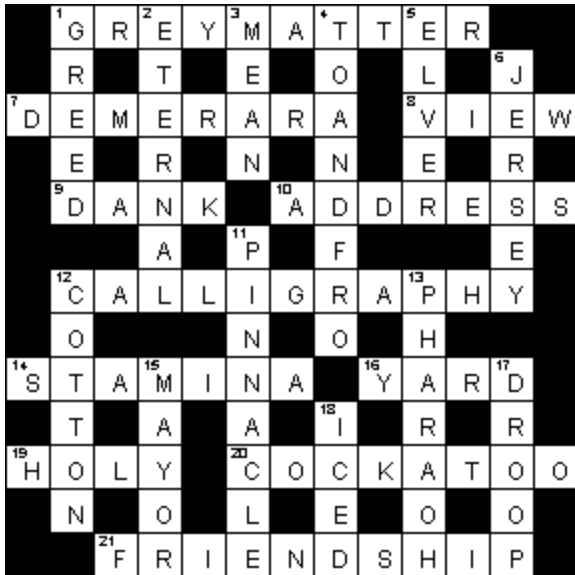

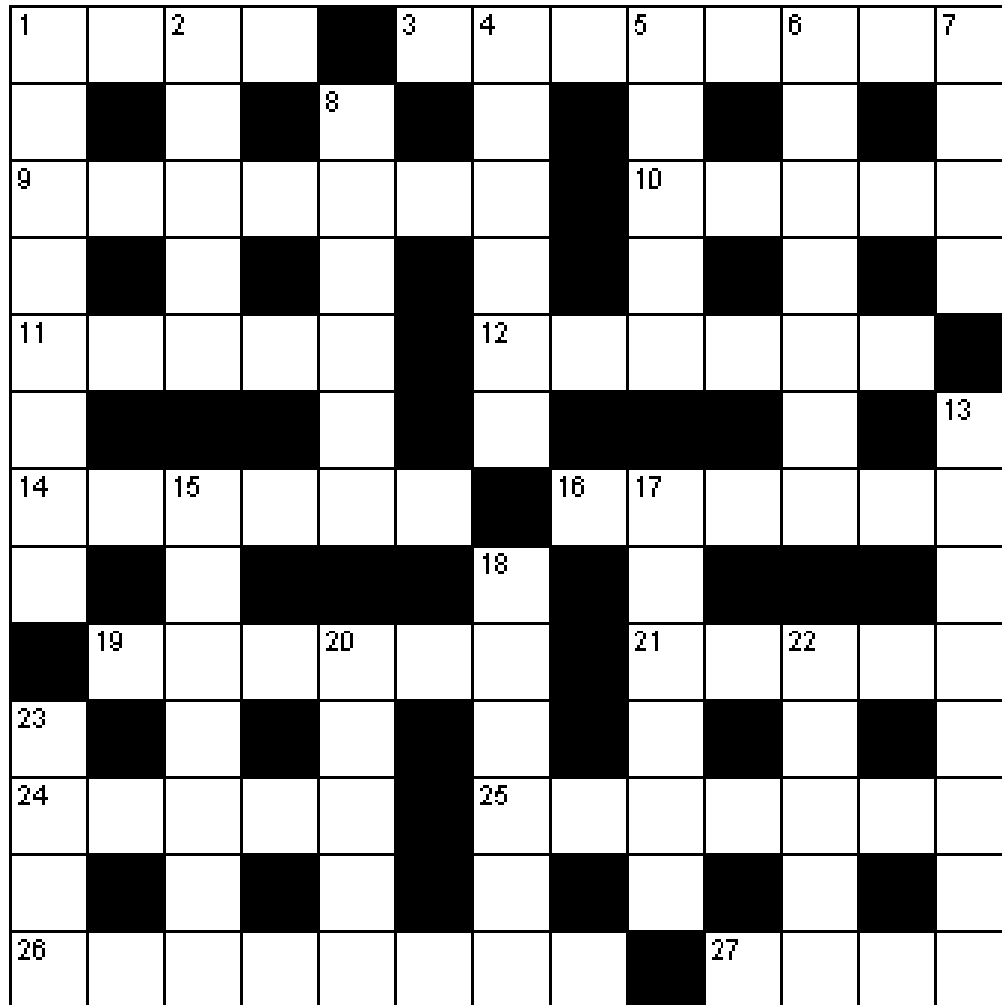
