# ***Lost in Translation***

I have always been interested in languages and translation. I am particularly interested in the roots from which we derive words. When I attended the ordination course the one thing I wanted to learn was Greek, as all of the New Testament was originally written in. I wanted to know for myself why translators chose certain words over others. I also wanted to know more about why the writers of the New Testament chose those words over others. Maybe it could shed some light on their intended ideas? This is why during and before the Reformation Bible translation was so divisive. The Church was very nervous about people translating things in ways that undercut its teaching. For example, St Jerome translated the Bible from Greek and Hebrew during the later part of the 4th Century into Latin which became known as the Vulgate Bible (Vulgate just means common). Up until the Reformation (1517), this was, and in large part remains, the western Church's foundational source of the Scriptures. However, people like Wycliff, Tyndale were all about putting the Scriptures in the everyday language of the people. Yet, it is hard to translate without changing the ideas people associate with certain words. Also In translating, there is no guarantee that you will convey what the writer originally had in mind. Jerome in this sense is the first to mess with the New Testament by translating it into another language, namely Latin. But what else are we to do? Especially if we want to open up the Bible to everyone. Tricky isn't it.

I think this love of mine with languages comes down to trying to understand things and to try and improve on my understanding. Nevertheless, at certain moments I have certainly failed to convey myself clearly, it is part of the human condition. The Church has often failed to communicate effectively in general at times. I also think that others have certainly not grasped what has been said. I remember one lady asking if she could breast feed in the church (before a wedding) and I said yes, she replied: "Won't God be angry?" I said "well, if He is, He's only got Himself to blame for it". Much has been lost in translation. Yet I think that we should all try and understand more about what it is we love, and love what it is we understand. The people who wanted to put a Bible in every hand wanted people to do just that. Nevertheless, it can be applied to all of life and to whatever it is we find important. To know, to love and to ponder. If we do that, we may just end up getting more out of this thing we all call life.

# News from your Parish Council

Burghill Parish Council held its monthly meeting at Simpson Hall on Tuesday 11th January 2022.

Twelve Councillors were present along with the Parish Clerk and Ward Councillor Pauline Crockett, there were nine members of the public present.

Members of the public raised concerns about road safety. It was agreed that the Parish Council would arrange for a specific meeting to discuss issues and potential solutions.

The Parish Council discussed two planning applications:

- Planning application 214436 - Wellington Lane Cottage, Canon Pyon, HR4 8NL. Application for variation of condition 2 of planning permission 202881 (Proposed first floor extension to the rear. Conversion of existing garage to family room. New front porch and dormers to the front of the property as well as new access, driveway and new garage.) For revisions to the proposed roof of the main dwelling/extension and the garage conversion. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application.
- Planning application 214529 - Annex at Ivor House, Tillington, HR4 8LN. Proposed change of use of annex to mixed use ancillary accommodation and holiday let. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application.

Our Finance and Administration Working Group put forward a figure of £5,150.00 for small grants, this was discussed and was agreed by the Parish Council.

Our next planned meeting is Tuesday 8th February 2022 at 7.30pm in Simpson Hall. We hope to see you there.



# Huge Congratulations to Sally!

We were all so delighted to hear that Sally Robertson had been awarded the British Empire Medal in the Queen's New Year's Honours List. Sally is so deserving of this award being such a devoted community spirited person. She has worked ceaselessly to raise enormous sums of money for good causes both in the village and further afield in Herefordshire in order to sponsor improved facilities for people of all ages and abilities.

She set up numerous sporting initiatives including the Copse Leisure Trust charity in order to create a football pitch and to install a children's play area with swings, a roundabout and a slide in Burghill. She has also organised sports days, fêtes and picnics for the whole community. She is now in the throes of applying for grants of £250,000 to build a new Sports Pavilion. In 2013 she was selected to represent Herefordshire and Worcestershire as their "Shining Light" for her work in the county promoting Community Games.

Sally spent 12 years as a very highly respected County Councillor working extremely hard always having time to listen to her constituents. She has also been a parent Governor at two local schools as well as chairing the respective PTFAs at both schools. She sat on three local Parish Councils, Burghill, Lyde and Lugwardine and was involved with the Burghill Neighbourhood Development Plan.

She set up the CAP scheme (computer access point) in the Simpson Hall to also include a regular library service and a community café. The money raised from the CAP purchased a printer and Sally now prints 3 Community magazines monthly and a variety of other communication documents.

Sally chaired 'Burghill in Bloom' and our village has won Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. Sally was one of the founder members of the Good Neighbour Scheme helping those who are lonely and in need and was treasurer for a few years.

Throughout her life of service she always had Ian her beloved husband at her side to support her. Unfortunately Ian died at the start of Covid lockdown but Sally has never given up and continues to serve the community tirelessly.

She is always so knowledgeable and inspirational and a wonderful role model to young people as well as being a lifeline to the disadvantaged and elderly in our society.

# STICKS AND STONES

Remember those days when playing as children we called each other names. Someone would claim the moral high ground and declare "Sticks and stones will break my bones but names will never hurt me". Now we are older, of course we know better. Metaphorical stone throwing can be just as vicious and damaging as the real thing, and certainly leads to the real thing. Nobody with any sense of decency wants to cause offence by their insensitive use of language. This, naturally enough, is why we tailor our language according to the social situation in which we find ourselves. In the present socio-political climate we are highly sensitive to these issues, perhaps more so than ever before. Of course language changes, words come and go and those which remain often take on new shades of meaning, new connotations. If our language changes then so does our behaviour, for language use is a form of behaviour – as far as we humans are concerned, a fundamental form of behaviour. Language doesn't just reflect the way we think, it largely shapes the way we think, and in doing so it shapes our behaviour as a whole. But these changes take place against a relatively stable background as to the meanings and appropriate use of words. Such stability, tacitly agreed upon, is a condition for the use of any language whatsoever. Being sensitive to appropriate usage means being sensitive to the feelings of other people, but it also means being sensitive to the fact that certain names and phrases only become offensive when *used* offensively. So much depends on the context of language use, and the intentions and attitudes behind it. It's not so much that words or names are offensive in themselves, it's the name calling, the mean spiritedness, which is objectionable.

'Virtue' is an example of a word which is no longer fashionable but which, it seems to me, is in need of revival. Arguably the greatest of all the virtues is benevolence, for it's our failure to treat each other as members of the same kind, i.e., with kindness, that causes so much ill will. No doubt there will always be people with an undeveloped sense of decency who will continue to use verbal sticks and stones; the challenge is to educate, argue with and hopefully persuade such people to be kinder -- and thereby use kinder language. But this is not something to be achieved through brow beating or calling other people names -- the tactics, in other words, of the playground bully.

# GARDENING CLUB

## ***Hedges are Wonderful Things***

When moving into a newly built property, the desire for instant privacy and territorial demarcation tends to favour the wooden fence. Yet if you are intending to stay for a longer length of time, it is well worth considering the considerable advantages of a hedge instead.

A hedge, for example, gives a more nurtured and private feel to a garden space. This is further enhanced by the visual effect of a hedge blurring the boundary, thus letting the eye smoothly run beyond it into trees beyond the property, creating a sense of greater space.

A hedge is far superior to a fence acoustically too: one of the best plants for this is Viburnum rhytidophyllum, which has furry stems and ridged, shiny upper leaf surfaces with felted undersides. These have been found to both refract and dampen noise most effectively. Viburnum rhytidophyllum grows in both sun and light shade conditions.

Hedges are also far more attractive: plant a mixture of hedging plants which flower, fruit or colour up at different times of year and you will create a constantly changing tapestry of interest.

A hedge makes a thicker barrier than a fence and offers small wild creatures a corridor, a refuge from predators and a nesting environment.

A hedge can enhance the security of your boundaries if you choose a spiky type of hedging plant (such as Berberis, Blackthorn or Pyracantha) to deter intruders.

One of the hedge's greatest advantages is its ability to filter out diesel and dust particles from the air. It does this as the air passes between the leaves and the twigs, which then attract and hold the pollutants. If a road runs past your boundary, it is a hedge you need.

A hedge has superior resistance to strong winds because wind passes through the foliage to a greater or lesser degree. They thus make effective wind breaks where a solid fence panel would blow out. This resilience relies on trimming the hedge correctly – that is, with the width of the top of the hedge being narrower than the width of the base. A solid fence causes strong wind to hit the flat surface on the windward side, then back swirl in a reverse spiral over the top of the fence and around the inside surface of the panel. This can sometimes result in more damage to plants and fixtures than if they were directly open to the wind.




