If on the other hand you want a happy life, be the authentic you and you will have peace inside, but maybe not outside of you. When I look at the life of Jesus, I see one who lived a fully authentic life who knew fully who he was. When he went to Nazareth as an adult he was rejected and chased out of town because he wasn’t being who people wanted him to be (Luke 4.16-30). At the end of his life on earth, he stood before a court who asked him: ““Are you the Messiah the Son of the Blessed One?” Jesus said, “I am; ...You have heard his blasphemy! What is your decision?” All of them condemned him as deserving death.” Others want their version of you and being that would have certainly made Jesus’ life easier, but it wouldn’t have been a happy one. My advice to you and the young amongst you. Get to know thyself and be happy with what you find. Love the “You” inside and be happy.

News from your Parish Council

Burghill Parish Council held its monthly meeting at Simpson Hall on Tuesday 8th February 2022. Thirteen Councillors were present along with the Parish Clerk and there were eight members of the public present.

The Parish Council would like to express their gratitude to Jane Ballinger for her efforts at the recent litter pick, well done Jane. Martin Doughty was also thanked for long service of looking after the local Speed Indicator Devices (SID's).

The Parish Council discussed three planning applications:

- Planning application 214668 - Land at Lodge Farm, Heritage Lane, Canon Pyon, HR4 8NN. Erection of agricultural storage. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application.
- Planning application 220041 - Burlton Court Farm Business Park, Burghill, Hereford, HR4 7RQ. Proposed commercial building. Although the Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application, they did ask for certain conditions to be attached, which included: lighting, working hours, no hazardous substances stored and that the building would be for storage and distribution only.
- Planning application 220079 - The Oaks, Burghill, Hereford, HR4 7RJ. Proposed extension. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application

Our Environment Working Group is working on a Herefordshire Council grant for Whitmore Pool Common. We have been promised that we will know shortly if we have been successful. Tasks for the project have been distributed and we are working on our new website so that we can get a "Friends of the Common" group going in the Parish.

A small parish wide working group is looking at options for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend (2nd-5th June). We hope to put on something on each of the four days. Do let us know if you have an idea or are willing to lend a hand. We hope to have a provisional programme ready for the April edition of the Community Magazine.

Our next planned meeting is Tuesday 8th March 2022 at 7.30pm in Simpson Hall. We hope to see you there.

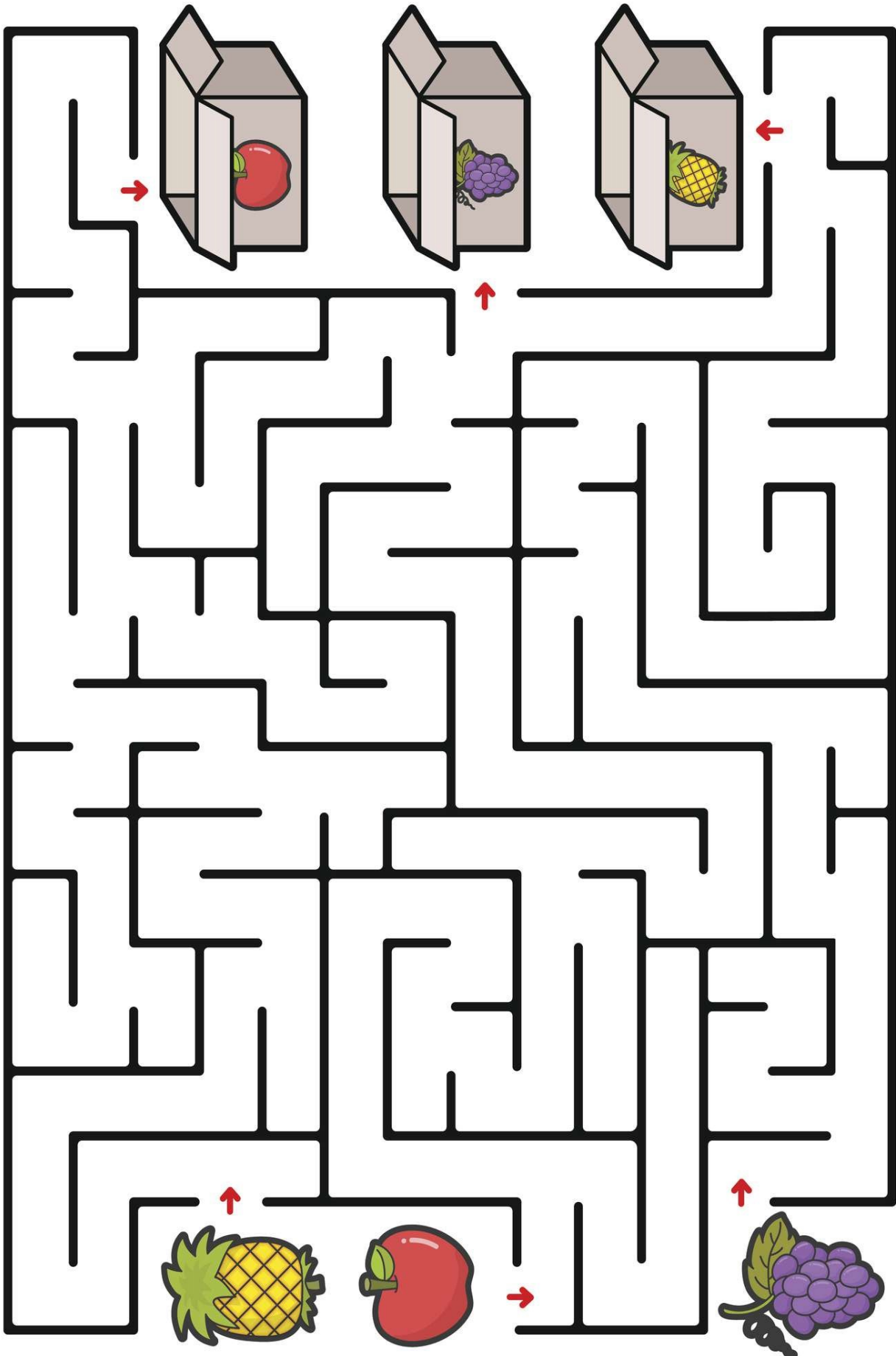

MARCH : For our meeting on Thursday 17th March it will be a talk by Rev Dr Phillip Brown of St Mary's Burghill.

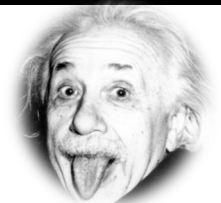

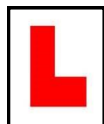



Herefordshire Wildlife trust – Weobley Branch report

On 3rd February more than forty people gathered to hear from Mike Williams about Weobley Wildlife Meadows. Illustrations took us from the tithe map of 1838 showing Nanylights Orchard and Tannhouse Meadow to the 21st century Lidar map of the meadows showing the surface contours in minute detail.

We heard about the changing history of land use around Weobley in the last two hundred years and how the meadows came to be acquired by Martin and Julie Peacock and have now been passed into the stewardship of the Herefordshire Wildlife Trust.

Mike reported the plant surveys on the fields carried out last summer and then outlined the plans being developed between HWT and our local branch to develop the meadows. These include replanting hedges, creating secure fencing to the meadows with disabled access, digging a large pond with a dipping platform, and planting a small orchard and a variety of native trees and, of course, introducing more wildflower species

Currently this new nature reserve has a relatively modest range of plants and wildlife habitat, which is exciting because we can watch it develop in the coming years... but its key value even now, is that the reserve lies close to the heart of the village and has a great potential foot-fall. This makes it a valuable “shop window” to advertise the existence and work of the Wildlife Trust, as well as offering a wildflower meadow and protected green space within the village.

Mike’s photos of flower rich meadows in much less accessible reserves gave us a taste of what is to come in the year’s ahead.

On Thursday 3rd March at 7.30 in Hopelands Village Hall **Mr Andrew De La Haye will speak on “Standing up for Trees”**. (donation please: members £2.50 and non-members £3.50).

On 7th April a brief AGM will be followed by a talk **“All about Swifts” by Peta Sams** of Shropshire Swift Group

GARDENING CLUB

Get Rid of that Lawn Moss in March!

After the damp cold of winter, most lawns are looking a little below par at this time of year. Old, dead grass may have built up as a 'thatch' around the base of the turf tending to stifle new grass shoots, while moss has usually spread in the moist conditions at a faster pace than the grass itself and is now also clogging up the lawn. A little action now will transform the quality of your grass in time to enjoy admiring it and sitting out on it in summer.

Simply raking out the moss manually is not a long term solution, since such action tends to spread its seeds around the lawn. It will need to be killed off first.

It is a good idea to begin by applying a lawn moss killer to eliminate this competition to your grass. Moss killers are generally sold in powder or granular form – liquids usually being more appropriate for smaller lawns and powders for larger lawns.

It is very important to apply all moss killers at the exact recommended rate, and distribute them evenly over your lawn. 'More' is definitely not 'better', for uneven dollops may kill your grass as well and will certainly leave unsightly black patches.

After about ten days, the moss will have turned either black or brown and should have died off. Now you can mechanically remove the dead moss and dead grass layers from last year in one go. For a smaller lawn, use a wire 'spring tine' (or 'lawn') rake, dragging the springy wire teeth of it energetically through the grass to remove both moss and dead 'thatch'.

For a larger lawn, where the bigger area would make this impractical, you can buy, or sometimes hire, a mechanised lawn 'scarifier'. Scarifying can be a little bruising for the grass so it is recommended to do it early whilst the tough, overwintered grass is prevalent; later on, the young, new growth is tender and can be damaged.

If the area of moss was very large and you end up with bare patches, fear not: wait about six weeks after applying the moss killer, sprinkle some good, sieved soil onto the bare patches and mix in a little replacement seed. Remember that lawns in semi-shaded areas will require special shade-tolerant grass seed if it is to survive.

If all this sounds a little over-energetic, there are local lawncare firms who can do this job for you.

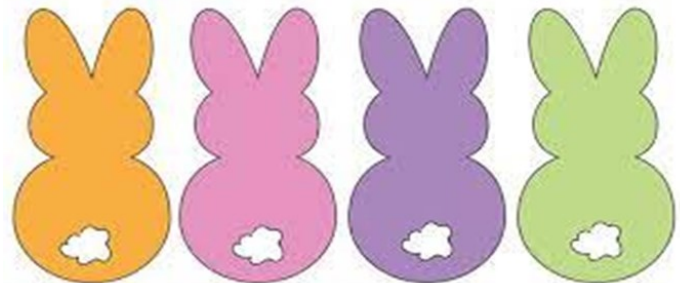

BEING THERE

What a wonderful mystery is the fact of our being here, existing in the world alongside other people, with all the different creatures and surrounded by inanimate objects. We as human *beings* existing in a total world of *Being*.

Each of us, if lucky enough, has a particular place to live, a place to call home, a country to belong to. And by the very nature of things we can only be in one place at a time. Looked at from a different perspective, however, we all of us share one place and time, for we all live, moment by moment, at the same time within this one world. Each of us has his or her own individual *here* and *now*, but our presence here and now is continually escaping us as we are propelled into a non-existent, continuously shrinking future. And all the while dragging our past along with us, a past which no longer exists but which is continuously expanding.

The ongoing nature of our experience, in other words, is one of unfolding temporality. As the philosopher Heidegger suggested, we are not so much stationed *here and now* as *being there* -- *being* rather than just beings, 'thrown' out of a past that determines our trajectory. Yes we are *conscious* living humans rather than inanimate objects, *rational* creatures rather than merely animals, *people* rather than merely creatures; but categories such as these, according to Heidegger, only obscure the deeper sense in which man stands out clearly from everything else. Man is part of Being as a whole, but one which is uniquely unfolding out of it. And this is the essential feature of Man's very particular 'being-in-the-world', a world both natural and of our own making which we share with others. We are not just being in the world, we are presented with it -- here or there or somewhere, culturally and historically situated, present 'now' but forever projecting ourselves onto horizons of future possibilities. We are, as it were, the very space or temporality in which reality shows up -- a part of existence for which existence itself is a question, an issue, a concern. Only for us does the question of Being arise; only for us *can* the question arise. We have no choice but to be anxious about the state of the world and our tenuous presence within it. Even deciding *not* to care is just one more way of being caught up in caring. And this is why Man, despite all his negative attributes, is uniquely fitted to take on the role of guardian, adopting an ethics which, as Heidegger has it, "ponders [care-fully] the dwelling-place of human being".

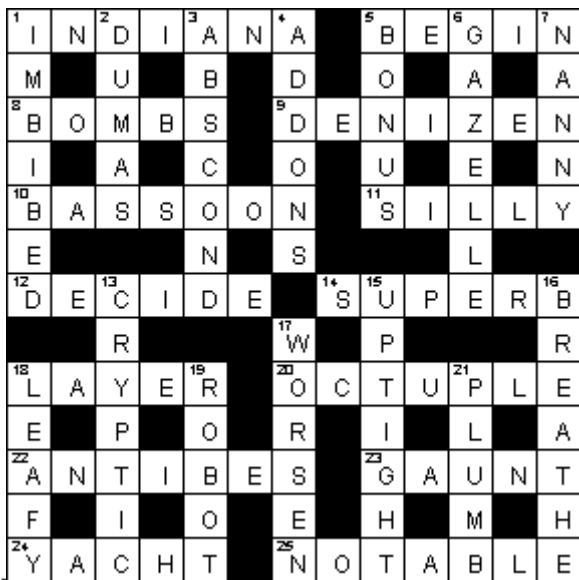

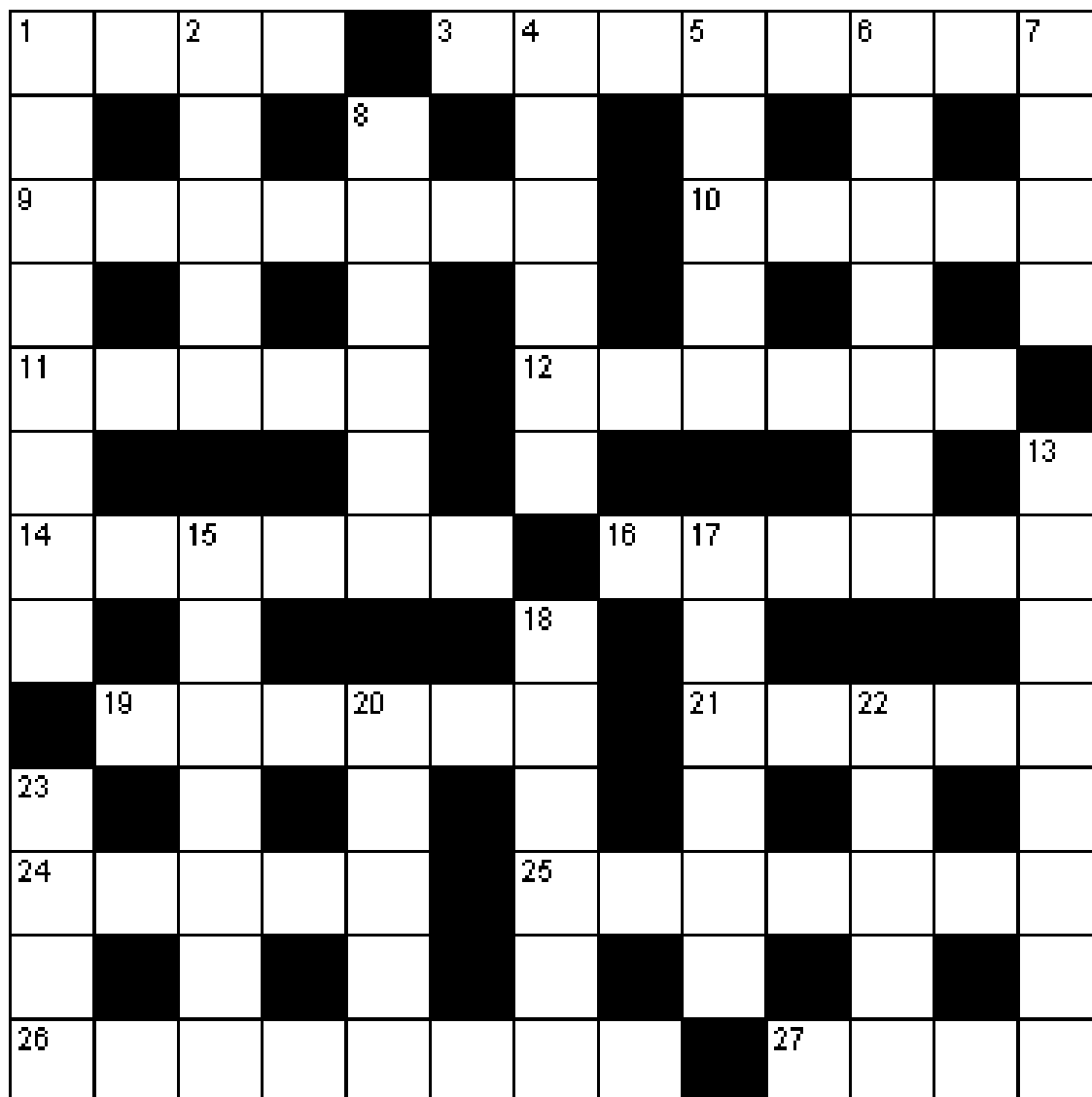
