Just recently I have started looking back to my younger days. I've started watching a lot of Boney M. concerts as this band was a large part of my childhood soundtrack. Another one was the album soundtrack to the Lady and the Tramp. The "Siamese Cat Song" was a particular favourite. Looking back at old photos, I realise that it was all such a long time ago and though I have those memories I am also reminded that that time has gone. There is a sadness to this aspect to nostalgia, because it is a hark back to simpler times. Having said that, being the youngest of 3 brothers was no easy task. Especially when they were both army-barmy and slightly wild with it. I remember my middle brother getting Lofty Wiseman's survival book. In the woods by us he was busy. He said to me one day, "I've made some man traps in the woods, go and find them". I tactfully declined. One of my favourite stories of the past was the incident in the Bank. I was twelve, Nick was fourteen and Dave was sixteen. Dave had bought a replica pistol and had broken the handle so needed to take it down town to get the gunsmith to fix it. Before this, he had to go into the Midland Bank to get some money. Nick (who was the mad one) wanted to hold it, so on the way he stuffed it down his pants before we got into town. When we got to the Bank, Dave went up to the teller and Nick and me stood against the wall inside the bank. All of a sudden, I heard a thud and looking down on the Banks floor was the gun! Nick picked it up and calmly stuffed it back into his pants and we left. Thankfully no one noticed. With my two brothers, I could tell you dozens of stories like this.

If you ever think I am not quite a normal Vicar, there is a strange childhood behind me that will explain alot! Yet, I have profoundly fond memories of the past and I had the most unconventional childhood in some ways. In other ways it was all very conventional. Nevertheless, in looking back I realise that that time is long gone, and my life today is a million miles away from that. In this sense nostalgia can be dangerous, because it can blind us to the life we now live and the treasures of today. For in the end all we have is today for the past is dead and the future is yet unborn. All we have is today and it is a gift from God, which is why we call it the present because that's what it is. So don't forget to live for today because by tomorrow it will be gone.

News from your Parish Council

Burghill Parish Council held its monthly meeting at Simpson Hall on Tuesday 12th April 2022. Ten Councillors were present along with the Parish Clerk and Ward Councillor Pauline Crockett. There were six members of the public present.

The Parish Council discussed three planning applications:

- Planning application 220582 - The Hermitage, Canon Pyon, HR4 8NN. Refurbishment of and extension to existing barn/stable and machinery store. The Parish Council agreed to raise no objections to this application.
- Planning application 220731 - Land at Green Lane Farm, Tillington, HR4 8LL. Proposed drainage arrangements. The site lies within the Lugg Catchment area and Herefordshire Council currently has very stringent policies regarding all discharge of waste from developments therein. It is therefore incumbent on Herefordshire Council to ensure that it is entirely satisfied that the drainage arrangements meet all the relevant standards. The Parish Council would need these assurances before it could support this application.
- Planning application 220998 - Agricultural building at Highcroft, Bewdley Bank, HR4 7SQ. Application to determine if planning permission is required for a proposed change of use of agricultural building to a dwellinghouse. The Parish Council agreed that this was a technical issue and Herefordshire Council will need to take a view on it.

We currently have a Parish Councillor vacancy, if you are interested then please contact the Clerk clerk@burghillparishcouncil.gov.uk

Our Finance and Administration Working Group gave a positive overview of the Parish Council's financial position. Funding for the Whitmoor Pool Common project, an offer of support to the school and a donation to Herefordshire Heartstart were agreed as was a budget for Jubilee related events.

Our Community Working Group is working on the purchase of a new Speed Indicator Device (SID), the overhaul of the website and the bus shelter at Leasown, it was suggested a bus shelter also be placed on the bus stop in Tillington.

Our Environment Working Group updated the meeting on the progress of work to Whitmore Pool Common and the work is progressing well.

The Parish Council gave a vote of thanks to all those involved in the Litter Pick on 12th March.

A small parish wide working group is finalising options for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend (2nd-5th June). A full programme will appear in the May edition of the community magazine.

The Annual Parish Meeting will take place on Tuesday 24th May in Simpson Hall. The Parish council and other community organisation will be invited to give brief reports on activities over the last year. The main agenda item will be road safety in the parish.

Our next planned meeting is Tuesday 10th May 2022 at 7.30pm in Simpson Hall and will be the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council - we hope to see you there.

The Community Café

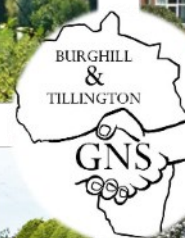
Our **café** is open every second Friday of the month from 10 until 12 noon for drinks, delicious cakes and good company, in the Simpson Hall.

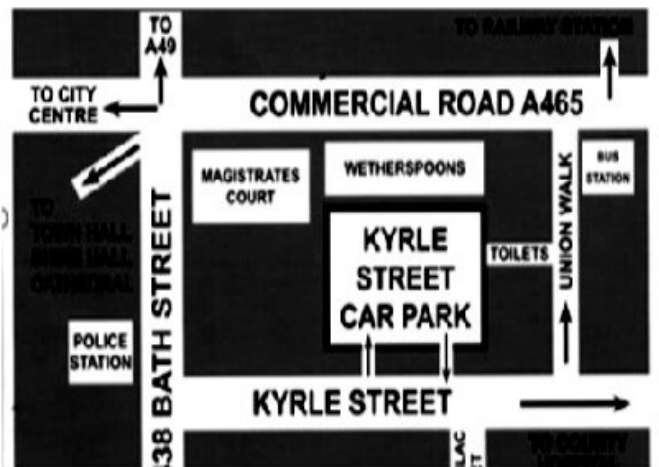

BURGHILL RANGERS F.C



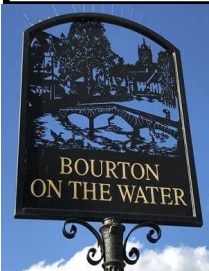

Whitmoorpool Common Restoration

We are delighted to announce that the Parish Council has been awarded a grant from Herefordshire Council Climate and Nature Grant Scheme to restore Whitmoorpool Common.

The scheme will run from now until the end of July. Some tree work will be undertaken this month, where possible and checked clear of nesting activity. SPIRIT

There are many different uses of the word 'spirit', all of them related to each other in some family resemblance kind of way. When used as a common noun, 'spirit' denotes something non-physical, when used as a noun in relation to a person it denotes something like an inner driving force, the essential core of a person's character or being. There are of course many and various religious interpretations of spirit from which to choose. However, leaving these to one side, the question arises as to the possibility of forming a coherent, naturalistic conception of spirit – naturalistic, that is, as distinct from supernatural. If spirit is a thing which, as the dictionary has it, constitutes "the non-physical part of a person", then what on earth is it supposed to be?

One fairly obvious answer here would be to equate spirit with the non-physical realm of mentality. We are, after all, quite happy to talk in naturalistic terms of mind as being activity on the part of matter -- mind, for example, as the activity of human brains. Another answer would be to equate spirit with energy, something which, from a scientific point of view, seems to underlie both the physical and the non-physical. Whether we are looking down to the quantum level or up to the stars, either way the fundamental feature of reality appears to be energy. And if both energy and spirit logically entail activity, fair to say that spirit is an active principle, applicable to both the physical world and the non-physical. It follows that spirit, as in the case of mind, is better understood in functional terms of what it can do, rather than as a *thing* distinct from bodies.

The German philosopher, Ernst Cassirer, would have agreed that spirit is an active principle, but only to the extent that it operates within human consciousness. We alone are able to respond to the world in spiritual terms because only man is able to create what Cassirer calls 'symbolic forms'. By means of transformative symbolic understanding we conceptualize the world around us. Life itself is a primordial given; myth making is man's primordial symbolic activity. Other symbolic forms include language, art, religion and science. Taken as a whole, these forms constitute the transpersonal sphere of human meaning at any given historical point. The dynamic interaction between life and spirit -- the twin poles of human experience -- drives the development of culture and our picture of how we fit into it. As Cassirer puts it, "Man knows the world and himself only through the image that he makes of both".

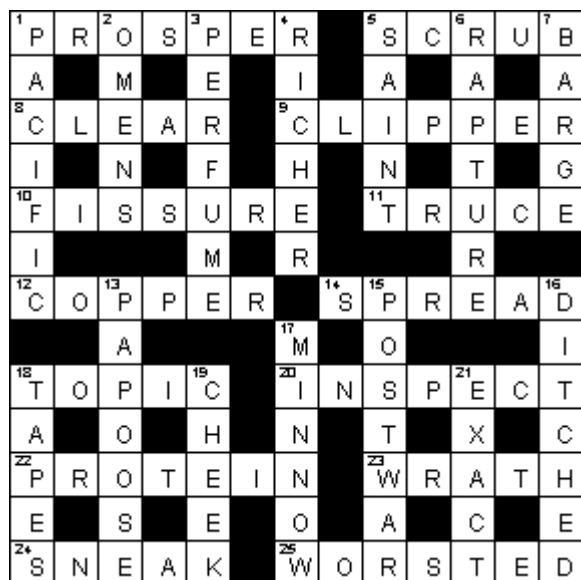

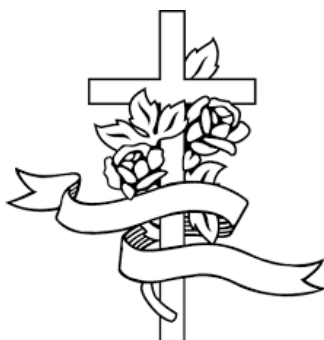

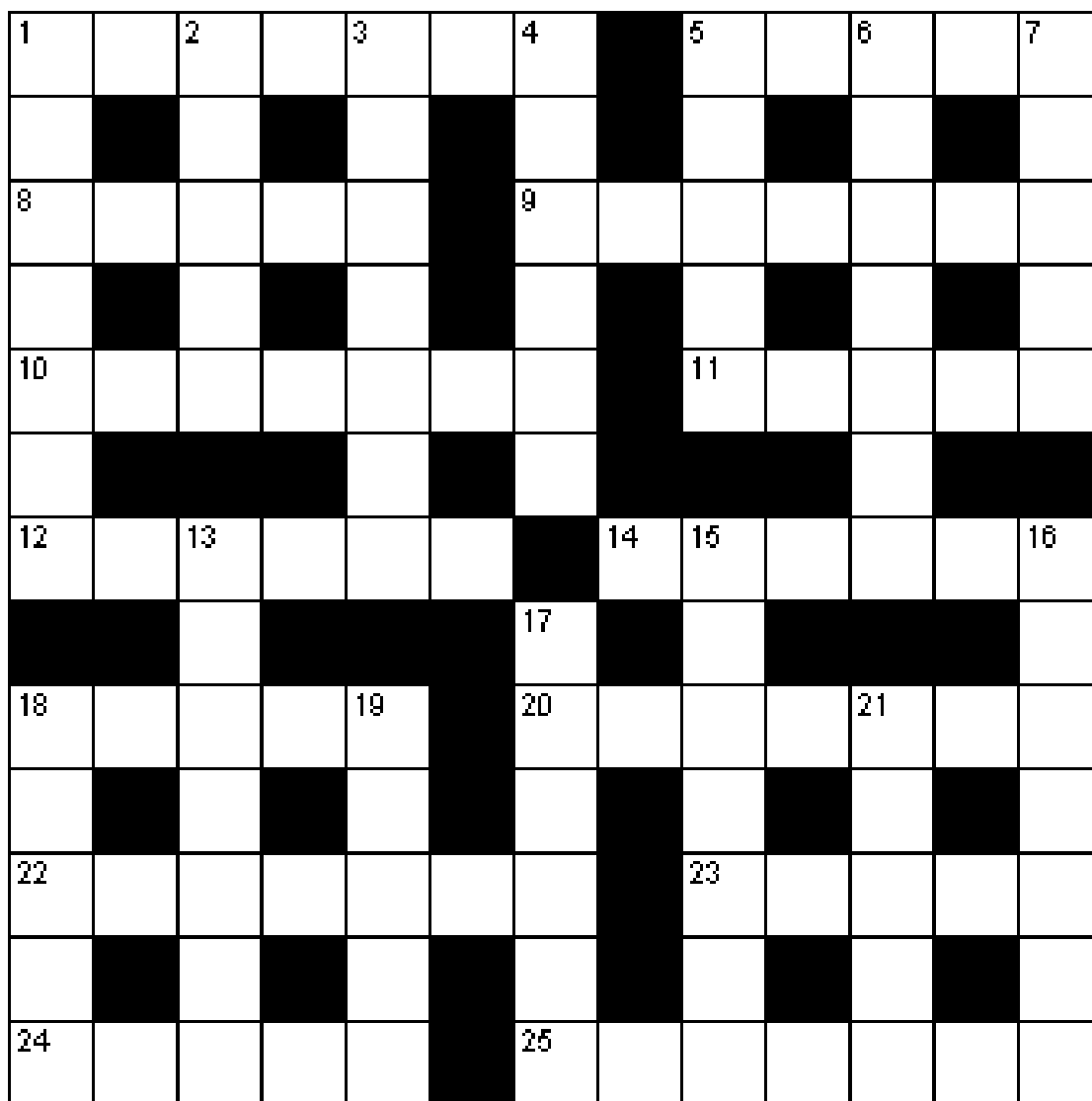
