Knowing When

My father taught me many things. He wasn't a man to talk much about his work, that part you had to try and piece together from odd bits of information. Yet, he used to tell us odd things, often to give us a pearl of wisdom. The funny thing is that at the time what he said made little sense but later on, it did. One thing he used to say is that as a bodyguard/security operator, was that you had to know when to be available and when not to be. I think this meant that you had to read the situation and know when they needed you around and when they would rather you weren't. I mean, you don't really want your bodyguard sat in the corner of your bedroom while the client jumped into bed with their partner! That is an obvious one, but most things are about reading people and situations and being aware of what you bring to a situation and what you may take away from it.

I think that is a good lesson for life as it begins with a sense of self awareness. Some people are better at reading people and situations than others. I think the primary principle here is the question: "What do I bring to this situation or what do I take away?". In the end, the result is the most important thing and sometimes getting in the way frustrates things rather than advances them. One of the skills I am becoming alive to is to know when we can get in the way of the things we want to happen. There are certain things that I try and deliberately remove myself from in order to let thing progress without me, because me being involved wouldn't be very helpful. I also (as a Priest) think that this is true for worship. When I trained for the clergy, my main tutor said concerning leading worship: "Don't get in the way of the worship". In short, he meant that it must move past us to God, not stop at us. If that is happening, there is a problem. I also see this in the story of Jesus. His disciples just kept getting in the way and completely misreading things. It is true that we all want to be useful and be in the centre of things, but this can be a form of vanity or at least a lack of humility to know one's own self. It is that lack of awareness that can get us stuck in the way of things because we don't know our gifts. We don't have them all. I would say that this awareness leads to a greater appreciation of other people and the gifts they have that we don't. Knowing when to step aside is to invite others to step in and bring to bear gifts we don't possess. It's a good lesson for life; knowing when to be around and knowing when not to be.

News from your Parish Council

Burghill Parish Council held its latest meeting on Tuesday 26th July. Ten Councillors were present along with two members of the public. There were no planning applications to discuss.

Our Finance and Administration Working Group oversees our financial position and reported on the latest financial reconciliation including reserves and financial flexibility. The Parish Council continues to have a healthy financial position which is likely to positively impact in the 2023/24 precept setting exercise, later this year.

Our Community Working Group is currently looking at the management of the three defibrillators owned by the Parish Council. These need to be checked monthly to ensure that they are safe and ready for use if needed.

Our Environment Working Group updated the meeting on the progress of work to Whitmoor Pool Common which had slowed due to a number of issues but work is now beginning to start up again. The grant applied for from Herefordshire Council has been extended to the end of the year to allow work to be completed.

A report was received on Herefordshire Council's Local Plan 2021/2041 and the Parish Council noted that Burghill's Neighbourhood Development Plan still carries its full weight with regard to planning applications in the parish.

Two new policies were adopted; Planning and Financial Reserves and our Standing Orders and Complaints Policy were updated.

Traffic management and road safety were discussed. The Parish Council's Chair reported back his recent meeting with the Assistant Police and Crime Commissioner regarding speeding and enforcement options.

The Parish Council is working with Herefordshire Council on two Traffic Regulation Orders a) an extension of the 30mph limit northwards from Danny Lee Walk b) an extension of the 30mph limit southwards from just before the school. The Parish Council is also looking to commission a second Speed Indicator Device (SID). Progress is also being made with a Bus Shelter for the stop at Leasown and possibly Tillington.

The frequency of Parish Council meetings was discussed, and it was decided to move to six meetings a year. This will allow the working

groups to meet up on a more regular basis. The Parish Council will now meet in September, November, January and March. Full details on our website.

Our next planned meeting is Tuesday 13th September 2022. We hope to see you there.

Start your Hyacinth bulbs off now for Christmas

Hyacinth bulbs are available now – and in two broad categories: 'prepared' and 'unprepared' (the latter sometimes just labelled 'garden hyacinths') . It is the former type, which have been specially heat treated to prompt them to flower more quickly, which you will need for indoor Christmas flowers.

Place the bulbs in a pot on a thin layer of damp bulb fibre compost. Fill the container so that there is a gap of about 1/2" (1.2 cm) between the soil surface and the pot rim and the tips of the bulbs are protruding slightly.

Bulb bowls are often sold for this purpose but as these have no drainage holes in the bottom it takes much more vigilance to avoid overwatering and rotting. I personally prefer standard pots.

The pot must now be kept dark and cool (aim for around 40 degrees F/4.5C) and the compost slightly damp, for 6-10 weeks. A popular way of doing this is to bury the pot in a shady place outside, covered with a 4" (10cm) layer of coir, bark or peat. A cool cellar would be even better. Check regularly to ensure that the pot doesn't dry out or become waterlogged.

When the pale, greenish-yellow leaf shoots are 1-2" (2- 4.5cm) high, move the pot indoors to a cool, unheated room, firstly in a dark corner for a few days, then nearer the window. At this stage, it is vital that the temperature is kept low or the leaves will go for the sky and hide the emerging central flower from view.

When the leaves have turned green from the new light source and the greenish flower spike begins to push its way up through the centre, move the pot to its final flowering position - ideally well away from radiators and heaters in a light, but not sunny, position - in a temperature zone between 60 and 70 degrees F/15.5C-21C.

After flowering, there's no need to waste your Hyacinths. Gradually reacclimatise your spent bulbs to colder outdoor temperatures and replant them in the garden, along with a little fish, blood and bone fertilizer to help 're-charge' them. They will usually return as fragrant Spring border flowers for many years to come, although they will never again bloom as early as Christmas.

MEMORIES ARE MADE OF THIS ?

As time goes by it becomes increasingly clear -- and in some cases tragically clear -- that memory is the most important feature of our mental lives. If we lacked memory altogether there would still be sensations, feelings and emotions, but we would remain unable to make any sense of our senses. Without the power of memory we would be unable to understand or re-cognize anything, unable to learn or use language, unable literally to re-call anything or make any meaningful use of our imaginative powers. At our normal operational level, memories of past experiences push their way into the present at just about every move we make. Hanging on to our memories, one might say, is like hanging on to life as we know it.

But what do we know of memory itself? Are memories stored specifically in the brain or in the body as a whole? Are they actually *stored* at all, or does the brain create them anew each time the necessity arises? Does it even make sense to speak of memory 'itself' as though it were a separate commodity?

Consider the following

thought experiment: Imagine a future -- maybe not so very distant -- when medical science has made it possible to perform brain transplants. An otherwise defunct brain can be transferred from donor to recipient, replacing the latter's irreparably damaged model. Certain questions now arise: given that donor brain function has been fully resuscitated, are donor memories resurrected too? If so, it looks as though recipient will have taken on donor personhood. To some extent, recipient has now become donor. Or should we say that donor has become recipient? On the other hand, if none of donor memories are brought back to life then recipient mind will be completely blank. Recipient's newly installed brain, being fully functional, will begin to create new memories, starting as it were from 'day one'. The other possibility is that recipient inherits only a limited amount of donor memory and thereby ends up as two different people.

If our thought experiment points to anything at all, it must be to the absurdity involved in thinking of memory as a discrete mental power tied simply to a physical brain. One thing for sure, the memory faculty is highly selective. The fundamental role of a healthy brain is to sustain memories of particular experiences and – what is equally important – to conveniently forget others. So what are memories made of? In a sense they are made of nothing at all, in another sense they are the making of everything we have.

Tickets for the draw that take place at each meeting will cost £1. There will be 3 prizes each draw.




