I LOVE CHRISTMAS

I love Christmas, always have. Even before I knew the story of Christmas, I loved it. My favourite time is Christmas Eve, because it reminds me of being a little boy who had a set ritual that night. First, we would put out some water and carrots for Santa and then we would have a shot of sherry; I'm pretty sure this was for my parents rather than us! Afterwards, we would all go upstairs and pick out our pillowcase to put on the end of our beds. Mine had a turtle on it. We would place it on the bed-nob at the bottom of the bed and go to sleep with fists clenched in inexpressible joy! In the morning, we would tear out of bed and dismantle those wrapped parcels faster than light.

The joy from those times was so intense that even today, the ripples of that memory touch the present. For what is Christmas without seeing the joy of a child's face and witnessing in them such unbridled ecstasy. All this joy has a root, a story which comes from a great past event, a story about the birth of a child, a long time ago in a country far, far away. But still, it comes to us and every Christmas we retell the story of why Christmas is with us. I never knew this story as a child really, but today I know it well and I have dedicated my life to its telling and retelling because it offers that same joy for us all today regardless of age. You may say: "what has changed?". In many ways, not much in terms of the world and of human nature. It still is as complicated and as prone to self-interest as it was. But what has changed is hope. The story of Christmas is a story to remind us that God is so concerned about our story, that He entered into it as one of us. Not just to share it with us, but also to share what He has to bring to the table. Jesus is the gift from God that says, what you have I take to myself, and what I have I share with you all. A life for all lives, and a hope that happened in history. The birth of Jesus marks the beginning of an extraordinary life of selfless perfection, unbridled love and an enduring hope against all odds.

His life shows us the joy of life and that ours is not just for a time but through Him, it is for all time, forever. God in Jesus redeems all things, everything that has passed, everything that is and is to come. Nothing is lost and we have everything to live for. Joy has entered in, and the Inn of our hearts must be open if we are to experience that childlike, fist-clenching inexpressible joy! Let us recall the past and clasp the present in the expectation of our future together forever.

News from your Parish Council

Burghill Parish Council held its latest meeting on Tuesday 8th November. Eight Councillors were present along with three members of the public.

The Parish Council discussed two planning applications:

- Planning application 222744 - Rogers Cross House, Tillington, HR4 8LJ. Proposed to separate into 2 properties by removing the link between the two main buildings, Rogers Cross House and New House. Single storey extension to New House. Division of paddock field between the two properties, to be used as gardens. The Parish Council agreed to support this application.
- Planning application 223532 - Penberry Cottage, Burghill, HR4 7RE. T1 Silver Birch (x2) - thin crowns by 15-20%, tipping back branches that are interfering with the BT wires, and tipping back branches growing towards the house and electrical wires by approx 1-2m. The Parish Council agreed to support this application.
- Our Finance and Administration Working Group oversees our financial position and reported on the latest financial reconciliation. The Parish Council have received a number of grant requests from local community organisations. A budget of £5,500 was agreed to fund these grants. The Working Group recommended that the Parish Council's Precept for 2023/24 is held at its 2022/23 level i.e. no increase. This was agreed.

Our Community Working Group is currently looking at the management of the three defibrillators owned by the Parish Council. These need to be checked monthly to ensure that they are safe and ready for use if needed. A new Website for the Parish Council is also on the agenda.

Our Environment Working Group updated the meeting on the progress of work to Whitmoor Pool Common, this has now been closed down for the winter and further work will be considered in the Spring

The Parish Council is working with Herefordshire Council on two Traffic Regulation Orders a) an extension of the 30mph limit northwards from Danny Lee Walk b) an extension of the 30mph limit southwards from just before the school. Funding has now been agreed with Herefordshire Council for a Bus Shelter for the stop at Leasown. The Parish Council is now looking at other traffic management options for the parish and welcomes suggestions.

Our next meeting is Tuesday 10th January 2023. We hope to see you there.

IT'S ALL IN THE GENES ?

Many animals display seemingly virtuous behaviour – alarm calling for example -- which puts themselves at risk for the sake of the group as a whole. Shall we call such behaviour selfless or altruistic? Awareness of danger has obvious survival value for the individual, but deliberately putting oneself in harm's way hardly looks like a survival strategy which could be established by means of natural selection. One thing seems clear: all we have to go on is their behaviour, and animals certainly protect and display loving care for their own kind, and not always just for their own kind. Add established virtues such as bravery and loyalty to their repertoire, and it starts to seem churlish to maintain that animals are incapable of altruistic behaviour. Evolutionary biologists have explained this kind of behaviour in mathematical terms of 'kin selection': the direct survival advantage for the individual creature performing such behaviour, *plus* any indirect survival advantages accruing from the inherited genes of its kin. Altruistic behaviour arises when the net benefits of the latter side of the equation outweigh the costs to the former side. On this understanding, the altruistic behaviour of animals is all in the genes. Animals can of course be dangerous and vicious too, but then so can the species *Homo sapiens*.

On the other hand, if genes are no more than encoded pieces of DNA molecules, then moralistic talk of selfish or unselfish behaviour at this level is perhaps misleading. Speaking more broadly, unless one regards 'survival of the fittest' as a moral absolute, natural selection is literally *amoral* – lacking any moral sense whatsoever. Then again, no one ever really thought that molecules in themselves were moral. We talk of *people* being morally good or bad; the question is whether we can sensibly extend this kind of appraisal to creatures other than ourselves.

The biologist, Francisco Ayala, argues that 'ethical behaviour' is a distinctively human result of biological evolution. Only self-aware beings with exalted intelligence such as ourselves can make moral judgements and evaluate the effects that behaviour has on others. But so-called *ethical* behaviour in this sense is really no different from the degree to which we abide by moral norms or principles -- and clearly animals are incapable of conceptualizing moral principles. It's not enough, in other words, to simply stipulate that animals are incapable of *moral* behaviour on the basis that they have no ethical principles.

The delightful winter flowering 'Moth Orchid'

Orchids are often overlooked by the amateur, who tends to think of them as touchy pedigree specimen plants for the skilled connoisseur only. Although this may be true of some exotic species, the Phalaenopsis, or 'Moth orchid' types are amongst the easiest long flowering house-plants. What's more, they are blooming right now.

Moth Orchids have a flat, vaguely Narcissus-shaped, flower. These are borne on a smooth upright stem rising up above a rosette of thick basal leaves at soil level. Several buds on each stem will open progressively and, in a suitably cool room, each bloom can remain fresh on the plant for over a month, which means an extended winter flower display.

Colours include various combinations of pure white, hot pink, burgundy, rose-purple or yellow, many veined or patterned for extra appeal.

In the wild, Moth Orchids come from the warmer regions of Asia and grow on tree trunks and branches, where light levels are fairly low beneath the leaf canopy; this makes them adaptable to the centrally heated home here. Thus for best results, choose a light position in your house, out of direct sunlight and not shut behind window curtains at night.

The best temperature range is between 60 degrees F and 86 degrees F or 16-30 degrees C. Water as required but never allow the plant to get aridly dry for any length of time, nor stand it in water or combine water with cold.

Research has shown that the aerial roots of these plants thrive better with some light, so you will see many of them sold in see-through pots rather than black ones. They are best kept slightly pot bound but when you do need to pot them up a little, try to use a similar pot and always use the special bark based compost sold for this type of plant.

After flowering is finally over in spring, cut the old stem off at the base and start a feeding programme of Orchid fertiliser so that the plant rewards you with another grand show next year.

One of the best things about Moth Orchids? The long flower stem looks particularly festive with tinsel wrapped around it!


The appeal was a great success and with the kind permission and pragmatic support of Burghill Parish Council, a beautiful bench is now installed on The Common.


