Nevertheless, our past is coloured by those sounds that make up our remembering. For example, I quite like listening to Rick Astley, Never gonna Give you up. Not because I liked it when it came out, but because when I listen to it now, it reminds me of a friend of mine from many years ago. Music is a mysterious thing.

For many years I have been visiting various care homes and seen people in the twilight of their lives. Many of them are being cared for because of Dementia. Yet, it always amazes me how music and sounds from the past can breakthrough into their minds and draw out vivid and abiding memories that seem to have been lost. So what is it about music that has such power?

I think one of the reasons is that it can cut through to us in a way other thing can't. It penetrates the very heart of us, exposing what we are within ourselves. Think about it: what music would make your top five picks and why? I bet you they are all tunes that either speak profoundly to you or draw something of you in a way other thing can't, like a memory. Music, it's a mysterious and magical thing, how could we live without it?

NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

Burghill Parish Council held its latest meeting on Tuesday 11th July 2023. Ten Councillors were present along with six members of the public.

The Parish Council discussed three planning application:

- 231477 - Land at Home Farm Barn, Burghill. Proposed cottage. This proposed development does not comply with the Parish's Neighbourhood Development Plan it is felt the development would be inappropriately visible at the entrance to the village and is too large for the proposed plot. The Council therefore RESOLVED to OBJECT to this application.
- 231618 - Yewtree House, Tillington. Proposed single storey extension and garage conversion. This was discussed and it was RESOLVED to SUPPORT the application.
- 231962 - 2 - Tillington Court Farm Shop, Tillington Court Farm, Tillington. Proposed variation of condition 2 following grant of permission 211913 (Proposed change of use of the former Tillington Court Farm Shop to residential dwelling with associated operational works) - minor design changes. This was discussed and it was RESOLVED to SUPPORT the application.

The Three Elms North East Quarter planning application was discussed with representatives from both Lichfields, the Development Consultancy and the Church Commissioners. A presentation was given, a copy of which can be viewed on the website. Discussions took place on the impact this development would have on transport, schools, doctors' surgeries and the general impact of 350 new homes being built for the area. The Parish Council agreed to formally consider the Planning Application at its next meeting.

A local Community Speed Watch initiative coordinated by West Mercia Police but managed and run by volunteers in the community was discussed. Several parish councillors volunteered to be on this group.

Speeding issues on the road near the school were raised along with suggestions to encourage drivers to slow down e.g., 20mph limit, speed bumps and a pedestrian crossing.

Working Groups are having difficulties in the current format, for a test period, an alternative on how they work will be looked into, these include projects allocated to Councillors. A finance group is required for diligence and monitoring purposes.

A Childrens Book Event run by Joy Carroll gave out 11 books to under 5-year-olds at this recent event. Plans for another event with Muddy Boots and the school more involved are in progress.

A noticeboard at Leasown bus stop will be replaced after it was removed to allow for the assembly of the new bus shelter.

There are currently four vacancies for parish councillors, these will be advertised. Dilys Price has retired from the parish council and was thanked for her many years on the council.

Talk Community HUB will from 1st August be organised by the parish council, Janette Pudsey will take the lead on this for the foreseeable future.



Maintaining Hedges

The Parish Council would remind residents that it is a legal duty, under the Highways Act 1980, not to obstruct the public highway without legal authority or excuse; and not to leave debris on it. The public highway is defined by law as consisting of any verge, footway, carriageway, bridleway, or footpath that is maintained at public expense and over which the public has a right of way.

This means that landowners and occupiers whose hedges run alongside the public highway are responsible for the maintenance of the hedge. Failure to adequately maintain a hedge and prevent a hedge from interfering with the use of the highway may result in a formal notice being served by the local authority requiring action.

Parish Council Small Grants Scheme

Over many years now the Parish Council has made small grants available to groups or organisations which support our local community. These grants are funded through the Council's budget. In a few months' time we will be starting the process of setting our budget for next year.

We would therefore, invite local groups or organisations to submit grant applications to the Parish Clerk clerk@burghillparishcouncil.gov.uk by the end of September this year. This will allow for the proposals to be considered and if they are successful, to ensure they are budgeted for. We will let applicants know the outcome of the process early next year.

Proposals will be judged against the following criteria:

Is the purpose of the grant request clear?

Will it be spent within the 2024/25 financial year?

Will it benefit the parish or its residents?

Does the group or organisation have a constitution or set of rules and a safeguarding policy?

Can the group or organisation provide a copy of its latest accounts / bank statement?

Does its bank account require a minimum of two signatories?

It is expected that groups and organisations will look at accessing different sources of funding for their project alongside any application to the Parish Council.





FLICKS IN THE STICKS

Neighbourhood Crime Fighting Teams are keeping your streets safe



Delivery on calls for a more visible and accessible police force, Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion has funded 55 officers to be recruited across five Neighbourhood Crime Fighting Teams (NCFTs) across the force area - with a sergeant leading a team of constables -

in each of the Local Policing Areas (LPAs).

The NCFTs will be working hard to keep persistent offenders off the streets and reduce levels of high impact crimes such as anti-social behaviour, drugs, major thefts, and criminal damage.

South Worcestershire and Shropshire are both leading the way with the new teams in place now and already supporting the important work of our Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNTs), Problem Solving Teams, Roads Policing, Proactive Teams and, of course, the wider force.

The teams for Herefordshire, North Worcestershire and Telford will be in place from September.

PCC John Campion said: “I am delighted to see two new Neighbourhood Crime Fighting Teams already serving the communities of South Worcestershire and Shropshire, with three more to follow in September covering the whole of West Mercia.

“Following my investment which has seen officer numbers reaching record levels in West Mercia, these first-of-a-kind teams in West Mercia will be fast-responsive units working in the heart of communities tackling the issues that matter to you.

“The teams are another example of my commitment to listen and deliver on your calls for more visible and accessible police officers, as I continue to ensure your police force has the resources and tools it needs to deliver a more secure West Mercia, as set out in my Safer West Mercia Plan.”

Herbs for the shadier and heavier garden

There are a good number of herbs which are ornamental enough to be included in more prominent planting schemes in the garden.

Although most aromatic herbs could generally be said to prefer a well drained soil in sun, there are many other attractive herbs for damper, heavier soils or for shade.

One example is the Mediaeval strewing herb, Sweet Woodruff (*Galium odoratum*), which makes a low growing ground cover with shiny, fine leaves similar to Goose Grass. In early summer it will be topped with starry white flowers. This one is ideal for dry shade under deciduous trees.

Dwarf varieties of the normally tall herb Comfrey (*Symphytum* spp.) are equally at home in dry or heavier soils in shade or sun. They even survive well in close proximity to some conifers. Dwarf Comfrey is semi-evergreen and bears attractive pendant, drop shaped, spring flowers in cream, pink or blue combinations according to its cultivar. Comfrey induces skin to heal over and broken bones to set quickly.

Other heavy soil candidates would include the sleep-inducing Valerian. Not to be confused with the raspberry pink, ornamental *Centranthus ruber*, (sometimes called 'red valerian'), true Valerian has flat heads of tiny, blush pink flowers.


Another heavy or light soil and shade candidate is Ladies' Mantel (*Alchemilla mollis*) renowned for its ability to staunch bleeding and treat womens' ailments. This low growing plant has froths of yellow-green flowers in summer and leaves which catch drops of water like spherical pearls.

The foamy cream flowers of Meadowsweet or the delightful lavender-mauve flowers of Sweet Rocket (which are also edible) will also establish well under heavy and damp conditions but thrive best in part sun.

There is even a herbal rose – and roses tolerate heavy soils well - the ancient *Rosa gallica 'Officinalis'* ('officinalis' shows it has been used medicinally). This is a summer-flowering, bright pink, semi-double rose with golden central stamens. Being semi-double, it can be pollinated by bees and hence orange hips rich in vitamin C follow the flowers. This rose needs at least part sun and was once widely used for eye ailments and for its tonic properties.



KNOW THYSELF

Know Thyself -- but what exactly is this Ancient Greek aphorism supposed to mean? On one level it seems quite pointless: how can I work at knowing something which I already know only too well? I am confused about lots of things but there is nothing I know more intimately than my own experiences, my own thoughts and memories. Other people might get to know me better, but what sense is there in being urged to know *myself* when I cannot fail to do so?

On another level, the assumption behind the aphorism seems clear enough: in order to *truly* know ourselves we have to work at it. Each of us is constrained by his or her particular situation and ability, but the living of a full and fruitful life depends ultimately upon critical self-examination. Only from a rational process of introspection can I think more clearly, more honestly, about why I feel as I do. Only by facing up to my shortcomings am I able to do anything about them and flourish properly as a *human* being. Through rational introspection, or so it might seem, we are able to come to terms with our irrationality.

But then again, just how rational is introspection supposed to be? Each of us has our own private feelings, opinions and beliefs, but what counts as knowledge is hardly a private affair. If belief cannot be put to the test, if it cannot face public scrutiny, then it hardly counts as knowledge at all. So how can I have true knowledge of myself when such knowledge, by definition, is logically private? I clearly know myself as a separate thinking and embodied 'thing', otherwise I would be unable to distinguish myself from anything and everything other than myself. I can also think of myself as an embodied stream of consciousness, or even as the proud possessor of a unified permanent 'self'. But no matter how or what I take myself to be, in what sense can I truly know myself when I am the sole arbiter of what counts as knowledge in my own private case? At whatever stage of consciousness I choose to introspect, what I take at that point to be knowledge about myself is bound to appear true to me. And this only means that the concept 'knowledge' fails in this case to get a foothold. If the physical eye can never directly see itself, how difficult must it be for the inner eye to perform any better! Just as we only get to see a distorted reflection of ourselves in the mirror -- what looks like the right side is really the left -- so too, and perhaps inevitably, with our the internal 'selfies'. The more we try, the more we seem to be looking through a glass, darkly.


