### **The Bird Meadow and creation of a Wildlife reserve**

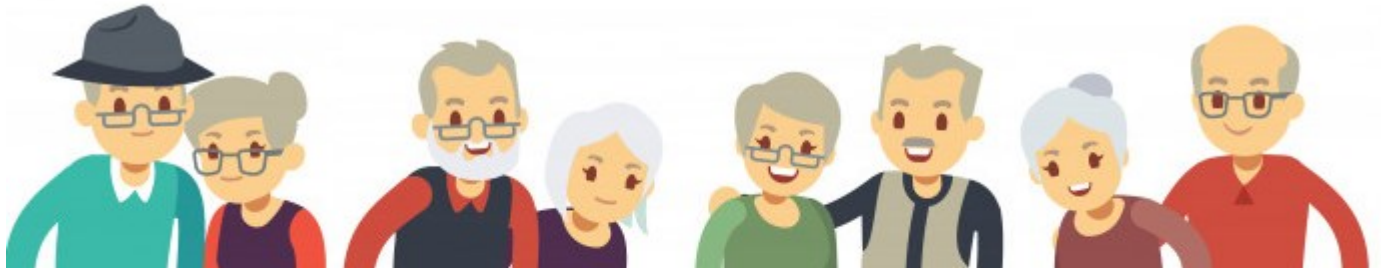
Some of you will have noticed that part of the field with the footpath from the orchard leading towards the Bird garage has recently been harrowed and planted. Our apologies for the muddy inconvenience that this may have caused.

With the help of the Wye and Usk Trust we have planted the field with wild flowers and hope to attract wildlife such as butterflies, bees, field voles, harvest mice and owls. Eventually we hope to even attract some ground nesting birds. In the spring when the grass has grown we plan to mow the original footpath and an extra permissive path so that there will be two ways through the field. We would be very grateful if dog walkers would keep their dogs on leads so that the wildlife isn't disturbed.

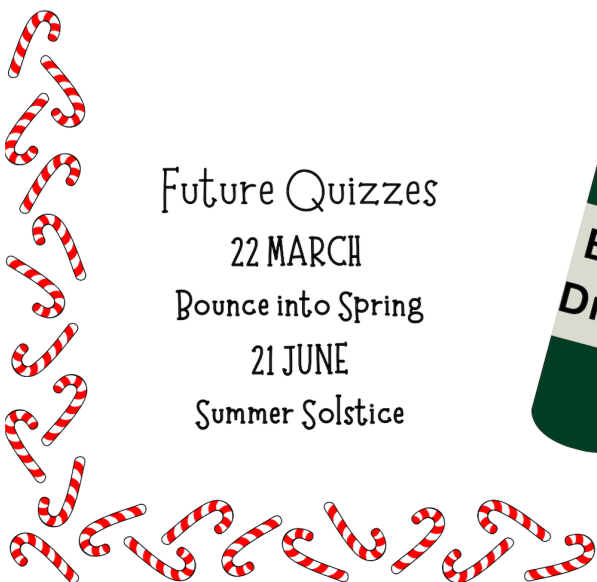

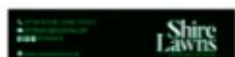

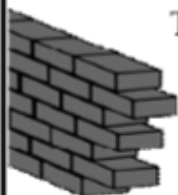

## The Delightful Apple Tree

Did you know that before the war, there were over fifty types of apple readily available for the consumer to buy? Yet look in any shop now to see that today we have only a tiny number of largely unexciting commercial varieties to choose from. Unfortunately the priorities for a commercial apple grower (dictated by supermarket buyers) are not necessarily those of the consumer. The consumer values flavour, but the commercial world instead needs heavy crops, large, regular shaped fruit, resistance to bruising, storage for many months and visual attractiveness. The solution to this conflict is to get a much better apple by growing your own. This will certainly involve a quest discovering less commercial alternatives to the ubiquitous Cox's Orange, Bramley or Golden Delicious - but the result will be well worthwhile.

First decide what you want your apple to do for you: no disease or spraying? Try 'Bardsey' or 'Red Windsor'. Dual purpose cooker and eater? Try the tasty 'Cobra'. A truly delicious traditional eating apple? Try 'Chivers Delight', 'Rosemary Russet' or 'Pitmaston Pineapple'. Local heritage? You won't get more local than the cooking apple 'Tillington Court'. Apples make superb garden trees because an apple tree's height and vigour is controlled by the rootstock it is propagated onto. This means that you can grow the same variety in a size to suit your space. The smallest will be a 6 ft (1.8m) tree on an M 27 very dwarf rootstock, which will need a good soil and permanent staking. With more space, you can grow the same apple in a larger tree size on a more vigorous rootstock like M.26 about 15 feet/4.5m or MM. 109 about 20 feet/6m. The widest range of apple trees (bare root or container grown) is available to buy this month. For really helpful advice, I always talk to the apple tree experts at Frank P. Matthews' 'Tree Shop' retail outlet on their nursery at Tenbury Wells and also check their catalogue information. (See [www.frankpmatthews.com](http://www.frankpmatthews.com) then 'Tree Shop').

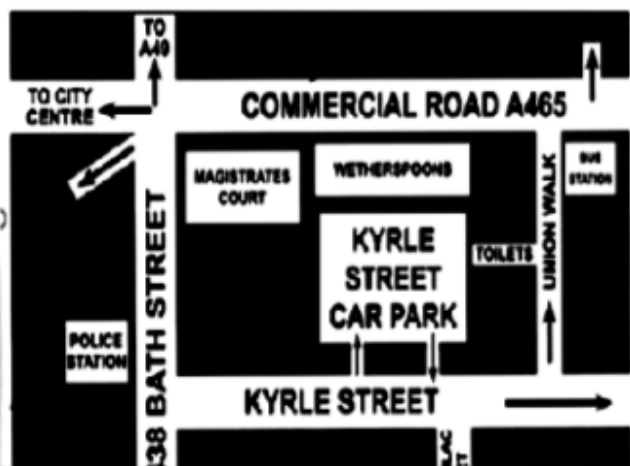

# BEHOLD MAN!

As we all know, each of us is born inheriting the genes of our parents; such is the fundamental component of our biological nature, the nature which is given to us from the very start. We also know perfectly well that without some form of immediate nurture we would hardly survive for more than a few hours. In this sense we are born not so much as ready-made human beings, rather as beings with the potential to become human persons. For in order to have any chance of becoming a fully formed person we require the ongoing nurture not just of parents in particular but society in general. At the very least, nurture is just as crucial to the development of our individuality or personhood as anything that might be inherited from our parents. If we get to the stage of knowing anything about our parents then we have already been sustained; that we get to know anything much further means that we have already acquired some form of language and cultural identity.

A fundamental component of our intellectual nature, one that has to be carefully nurtured, is the distinctively human ability to form an autonomous conception of how to live a worthwhile life -- the freedom to decide for oneself what has value and what does not. Exercising their autonomy, some people will embrace the prevailing social norms, others will question them, some will decide to opt out completely – always assuming, of course, that people have the necessary freedom to pursue their autonomous conception. The exercise of autonomy is always and inevitably under social pressure. And so it should be, for liberty is not the same thing as licence: the *taking* of liberties. If there are such things as human rights then all humans must have them and one's right to liberty must be compatible with equal liberty for all. We humans are the clever ones; no other creature on earth has the capacity to make the kind of brilliant decisions that we make, or do the kind of devastating things that we do. The very capacity to make evaluative decisions – to make judgments as to what is worthwhile rather than trivial, beautiful rather than ugly, loving rather than hateful – such a capacity only finds expression within the context of a particular society. And as we know only too well, different societies tend to differ. Indeed, the very fact of *human* agreement entails disagreement: if all human beings agreed with each other they would no longer be human. The trick, if only we could perform it, is to agree to disagree. Only time will tell how successful we prove to be. All we know for sure is that humanity is born.....*Ecce Homo!*

### THE COPSE LEISURE TRUST

Since we carried out the Public Consultation last year, we have been busy working behind the scenes to improve the facilities at The Copse. As a result, the following are projects we are pursuing or have already commissioned:-

Several responses indicated residents did not know what happened at The Copse so we will be providing regular updates in the parish magazine and on our Facebook page.

A new cradle seat and junior swing seat have been ordered to replace the existing seats.

The tunnel will shortly be removed as it needs replacing. The trustees have been looking at replacement play equipment for younger children.

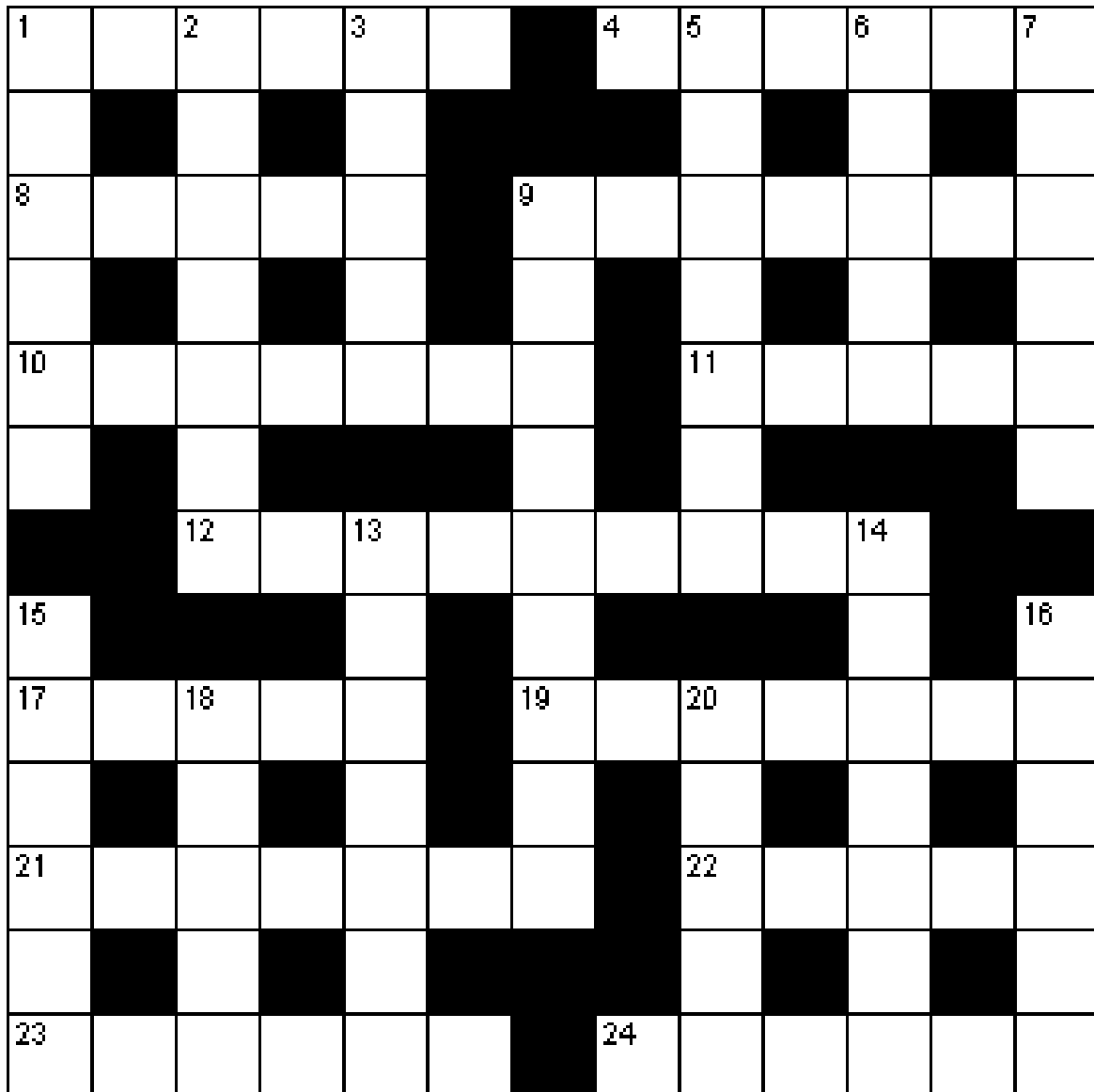
Improve access to The Copse especially for wheelchairs and prams etc.

Our Chairman has recently met with officers from Herefordshire Council and a representative from the Football Association with a view to possible funding for a sports pavilion, which received 85 per cent support in the Public Consultation. With only 3 years left on our current lease, we have submitted an Expression of Interest Form to either asset transfer The Copse to the charity (preferred option) or an extended long-term lease which will satisfy and meet the criteria of funding organisations.

We are very grateful to all the volunteers who support our work at The Copse and we will continue to investigate opportunities to improve the facilities for the enjoyment of our community.

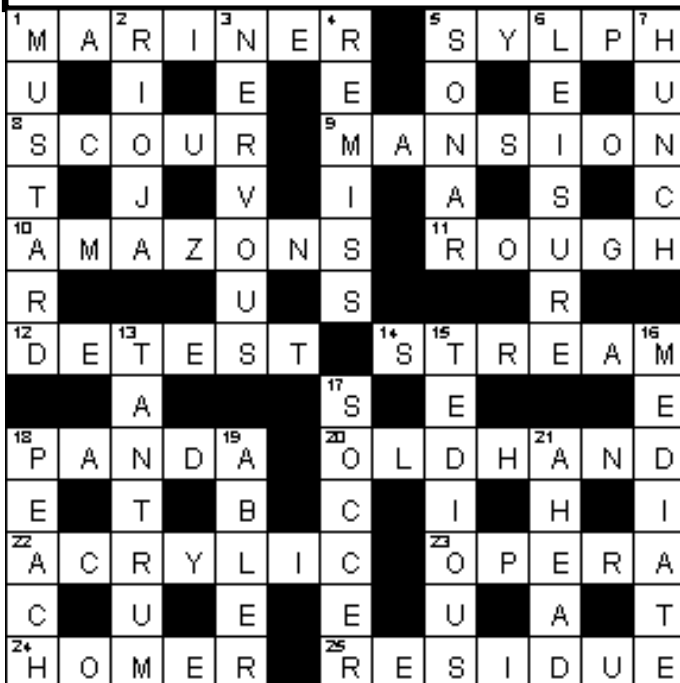
