What you see isn't always what you get!

Surprise, is that certain something that lies at the heart of Christmas. Well, we do it for those we love don't we. We love a surprise and a secret. We do secret Santa; we love giving gifts that brings a certain 'wow' factor. Yet, what we love is to surprise our loved ones with a real scenes of amazement. That is why we wrap our presents up and sometimes make elaborate shapes to disguise what is inside. We love to see our children's faces when they get caught out and get something they wanted but were not that sure that they would. On a more serious note, the original Santa, Bishop Nicholas of Smyrna (circa 300), gave a gift of money so that a family would not see their children into slavery. Nevertheless, a surprise gift is a wonderful thing, either from someone we know or not.

One thing I love about gifts, is that we give without any notion of reciprocity. We don't want anything in return, we that's how it should be anyway. But the reason we give gifts at Christmas is because of what happened at the first Christmas. The first accounts of Jesus' life tell us that, Jesus is not just a gift from God, but *the* gift from God. It comes to us as something very familiar, a baby. Yet, we mustn't be taken in by God's wrapping skills. There is more to this baby than meets the eye. St Augustine comments: "No one could see his glory without being healed by the lowliness of the flesh". In other words, the wrapping paper of His flesh is the only way we could see God Himself. Why? Well, God doesn't have a body, and so in order to see and know Him, He became what He was not, human. In other words, what those first people saw wasn't what the world was getting. The world saw a baby boy, but what we got was God Himself. What a gift, what a present and what a surprise! Merry Christmas!

Parish Council News

Burghill Parish Council held its latest meeting on Tuesday 14th November 2023. Ten Councillors were present along with eleven members of the public.

The Parish Council discussed two planning applications:

- 233046 - Building at Tillington Fruit Farms, Crowmoor Lane, Tillington. Proposed demolition of existing buildings and erection of three dwellings with associated works. This was discussed, the Council would like the drainage looked into and questioned the curtilage being extended beyond the original abuilding, the council RESOLVED to SUPPORT the application.
- 233059 - Land to the Rear of Green Acres, Roman Road, Hereford. Outline planning application for the erection of four dwellings and associated works, with all other matters reserved for future determination except access. The only issue would be the access onto the busy Canyon Pyon Road, the Council RESOLVED to SUPPORT the application.

Whitmoor Pool Common was discussed, there will be a formal agreement put in place to allow Burghill Primary School to lease part of the common from the Parish Council for school activities. The school has also been chosen to be a pilot scheme for a 20mph speed limit outside the school, speeds are currently being checked.

Councillors received a brief presentation on safeguarding and RESOLVED to adopt a revised Safeguarding Policy for children and vulnerable adults. Councillors also RESOLVED to adopt a new Code of Conduct. The Commons Management Plan was discussed as it needs to be slightly updated, it will be amended as necessary and brought back to the next meeting for approval. This plan will cover the next five years. Talk Community Hub is being well received at the good neighbour coffee mornings. The Talk Community team and the Health Watch team have both attend events and this was welcomed.

It was agreed to keep the precept at its current amount and small grants of £5,150 were agreed along with a donation of £100.

Our next meeting is Tuesday 9th January 2024 at 7.00pm. We hope to see you there.

Ringling the changes in 2023...

It has been a very busy year in the bell tower. We have been lucky enough to get some new recruits and we have had to extend the practice times to accommodate everyone and to help them to develop their skills. Our newest recruits (aged 12 to 50+) have all been making fantastic progress and we are thrilled to have them. However, we always welcome new people and if you wanted to find out more about what we do, or wanted to come and have a go, please get in touch.

Why do we ring bells?

Historically bells have been rung, not only to call people to worship on Sundays and for church festivals but to celebrate Momentous events such as the Coronation of HRH King Charles III and Queen Camillia. Also, to commemorate historical events, such as Armistice Day, where bells are rung half muffled to mourn those we have lost. Bells are also rung on special occasions, such as Weddings and New Years Eve.

You may have noticed that we have been regularly ringing on Sunday afternoons. The reason for them is to give an extended practice to our ringers, giving them an opportunity to consolidate what they have been learning on Monday nights. This seems to have really helped our learners progress and we hope to continue to do this.

Does practicing really make a difference?

This year the local band has managed to ring regularly on Sunday mornings for the services. We were able to celebrate the King's Coronation by ringing at all the churches in the Benefice (Burghill, Lyde and Moreton), we helped 6 couples celebrate their wedding day, and encouraged the runners of the Crocodile 8. We were honoured to commemorate the life of Henry Chandler (Tower Captain at Burghill for 42 years). Without this practice, we would not be able to do this, without asking for help from ringers at other churches.

Our band won the District Striking Competition in September and this band included 3 of our newest and youngest members. Practicing really does make a difference. We are also very lucky that expert bellringers (which includes some of our own ringers) come to ring at our tower once a month on a Thursday evening to ring a peal. This is a special performance of 3 hours and the quality of the ringing that we hear on a Thursday is some of the best you will hear in the country!

Brighten up December and January with Indoor Cyclamen

As the darkness covers the evenings and the rain pelts down outside, it is sometimes very difficult to remember that somewhere, far away, it is warm and sunny and that flowers are blooming in abundance.

One of the prettiest of these is the indoor Cyclamen (*Cyclamen persicum* hybrids). Although now bred to produce a range of larger, curved and sometimes frilled blooms in shades ranging from dark purple to burgundy, through pinks to white, its wild forerunners are now decorating the roadsides of the Middle East and Turkey.

The flowers stand up above compact clumps of beautifully marked leaves - no two exactly alike and many patterned with an almost silvery white.

Most of the popular types are also fragrant and so a decent number of flowers can scent a room with a lovely lemony-musk perfume.

Indoor Cyclamen are plants for the cooler rooms in the house (50-60 degrees F/10-15.5 degrees C. is ideal). They like good light (but not direct sunshine) and also appreciate humidity to counteract the dryness of our central heating. The easiest way to take care of the latter is to stand them on a tray of gravel much wider than the plant pot, to which a little water has been added – not enough so that the pot is standing in water but just enough to evaporate up around the plant and humidify the air around it.

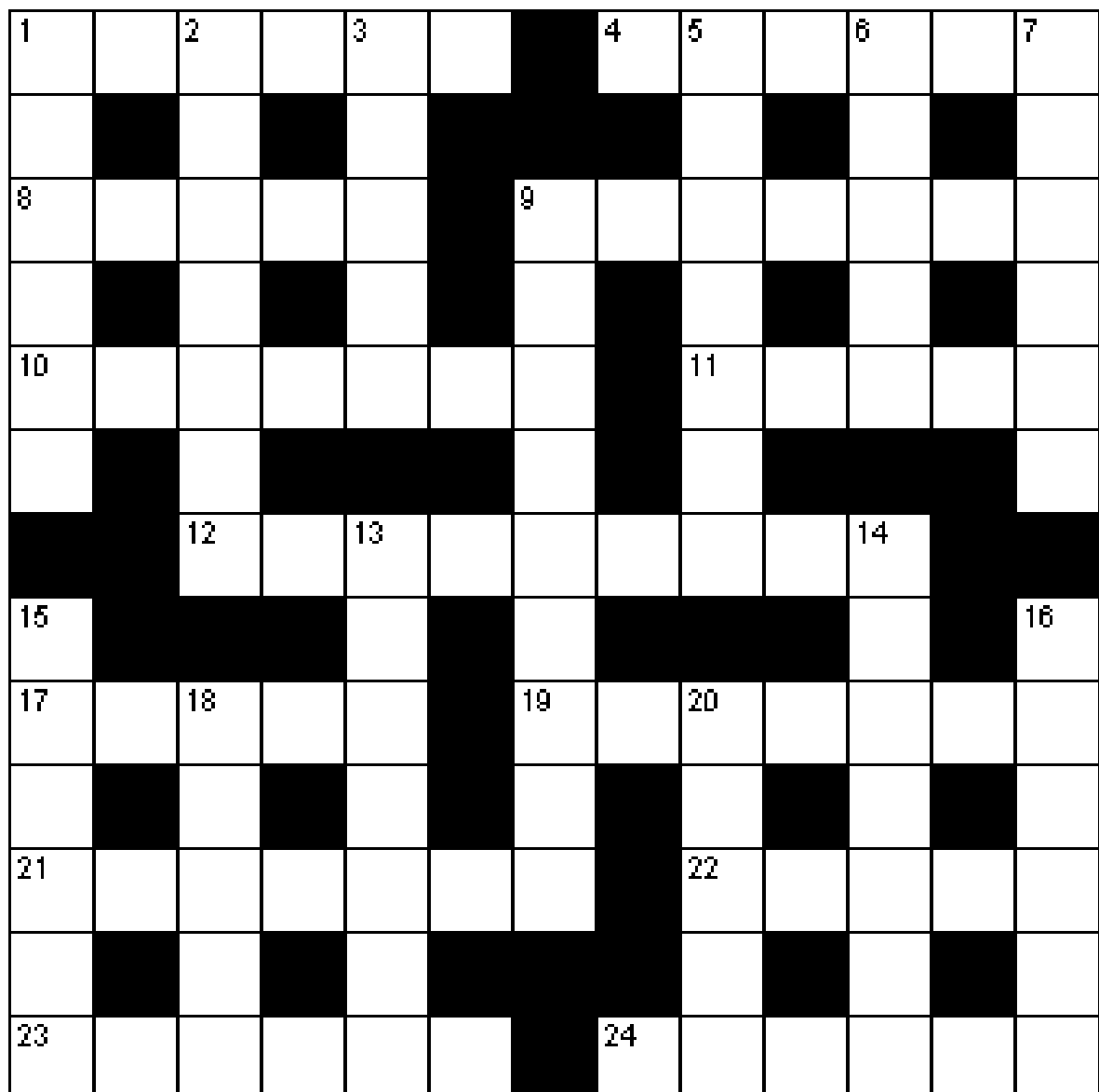
Correct temperature and watering will greatly extend the Cyclamen's flowering period, as will dilute doses of liquid feed while it is flowering (Tomorite or a flowering houseplant feed work well).

To keep your Cyclamen happy and healthy, it needs to be watered in such a way that water does not wet the round central corm at soil level, nor the bases of the leaves and flowers growing out of it. When the plant gets dry, gently put only the lower half of its pot into tepid water and hold it there until you can feel by the increased weight that it has absorbed water. Then return it to its gravel tray to drain freely with the top of the compost still dry.

.....and on the subject of houseplants generally: please do remember always to bring your windowsill houseplants into the room before drawing the curtains at night. Trapping them between the curtains and a very cold window pane will usually result in their early demise.

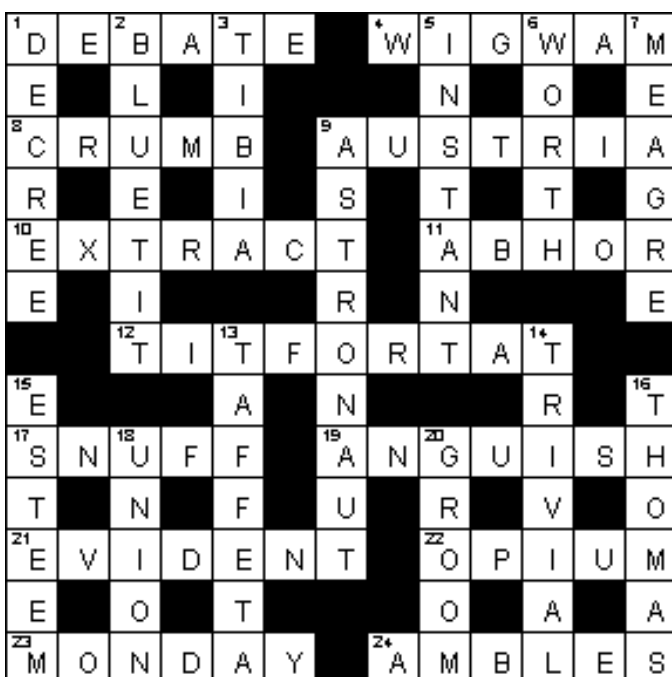
BAHAMUT

Over the centuries there have been various attempts to prove the existence of God. Sages, theologians and philosophers, all have had a say. Some have argued, for example, that *God exists* is necessarily true: *God*, by definition, is infinitely good and possesses all positive attributes; existence is a positive attribute; therefore God exists. Others, from a different perspective, have argued that evidence of design is all around us within the wonderful structures of the world itself: Design implies a designer; supreme design implies a supreme designer, namely God. Still others have argued from the evidence of causality in nature: Everything that happens has a cause; each cause requires a previous cause; causes cannot infinitely regress; therefore God must exist as the first cause.

Today, of course, there is no longer much demand for so-called *proofs* of God's existence. By and large we have come to realize that belief in God is a matter of faith rather than logical demonstration. This is not to denigrate faith in any way, simply to get clear about the difference between personal conviction – *I know God exists* – and the kind of impersonal logic which can neither prove nor disprove any such thing. Then again, imagine what it would be like if there really were a convincing proof -- a certain proof -- of God's existence. If everything were made clear and light as a result, what would happen to our distinctively human sense of wonder and awe? Even more worrying perhaps, what would remain of our distinctive form of humanity if we no longer had the excuse of human ignorance to fall back on?

With these questions in mind, consider the following Moslem tradition: God made the earth, but the earth had no base and so under the earth he made an angel. But the angel had no base and so under the angel's feet he made a crag of ruby. But the crag had no base and so under the crag he made a bull endowed with four thousand eyes, ears, nostrils, mouths, tongues and feet. But the bull had no base and so under the bull he made a fish named Bahamut, and under the fish he put water, and under the water he put darkness, and beyond this man's knowledge does not reach.
