# JUSTICE AND MERCY

At the heart of every human being is a desire for what is right, at least from their perspective. What arises in us is a profound sense of putting right a wrong. However, when we are in the wrong, that sense of springing into action isn't so appealing. All of us share the same impulses and instincts when it comes to ourselves. Once you get to grips with yourself, in many ways you get to grips with everyone else. We aren't that unique in this respect. Well, you may wonder what has sparked this topic for this month's article? It has something to do with Lent, a season in which all of us are invited to contemplate our own mortality and the injustice which arises from within us and also the current Post Office Scandal.

At the heart of the story is an ancient well-known tail of injustice, corruption, and an unwillingness in the extreme to condemn oneself in order to render justice and mercy to others. I say to the extreme because many were falsely accused and convicted of crimes that they did not commit. Some went to prison, and some took their own lives because an institution could not admit any fault. Sometimes, to render justice to another requires condemnation of oneself. What history tells us is that this butts up against the ego and is often suppressed out of weakness. For me, it is a painful story in that the head of the Post Office was an ordained Priest, but this doesn't surprise me as the myth of the moral ivory tower of the clergy has long since collapsed. Why? Because clergy are human beings and are as weak and feeble as others. Don't expect perfection from any in this world! St Paul wrote: 'For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard' (Romans, 3:23). Another saint referred to humanity as a 'massa damnata' a lump of perdition.

Nevertheless, Lent is a time to purge and get to grips with what lies in the heart of us. Change begins in the heart, and we begin with our own. It is also a time to remember God knows us and what we are made of, dust. We are creatures of the earth. That is why the cross for Christians is so important, because it reminds us of the Justice and mercy of God, who took unto Himself our nature in Christ and proclaims us forgiven. We are all in some sense in need of justification and mercy. Lent is an invitation to right the wrongs of the past and prepare for tomorrow.

# Parish Council News

Burghill Parish Council held its latest meeting on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2023. Twelve Councillors were present along with seven members of the public. The Chair welcomed Parish Councillors, our Ward Councillor and members of the public and wished everyone a Happy New Year!

Three Parish Councillors were co-opted onto the Council; Tim Gilbert, Scott Bristow and Neil Marks. The Chair welcomed Tim and Scott and asked them to join the meeting. Neil was not present this evening. The Parish Council has one more vacancy to fill.

- The Parish Council discussed one planning application [\\_233760](#) - St Marys House, 16 St Marys Lane, Burghill. This was for the replacement of the existing conservatory with a new brick-built extension. This was discussed, and the Council RESOLVED to SUPPORT the application.

The Parish Council was also asked to comment on a licensing application for Burghill Valley Golf Club to bring forward the daily hours for the Sale/Supply of Alcohol from 10.00am to 9.00am. After considering the licensing objectives the Parish Council RESOLVED to make no comment on the application.

An update was received on Whitmoor Pool Common. The Parish Council is proposing to lease part of the Common to Burghill Community Academy for school activities. This is moving forward and the lease should be in place by the next meeting in March, if not before.

An update was received on the joint proposal with Herefordshire Council to introduce a pilot 20mph limit adjacent to School. Progress is being made and the Parish Council is hopeful that it can be introduced later this year.

The speed limit reduction from 40mph to 30mph adjacent to Danny Lee Walk was also discussed. This should be

implemented shortly.

It was RESOLVED to adopt a revised Management Plan for the three Commons owned by the Parish Council.

It was reported that the Parish Council is managing its finances effectively and expected to be within budget at the end of the financial year.

After careful consideration the Parish Council RESOLVED not to participate in Herefordshire Council's 2024/25 Lengthsman Scheme. It was agreed that the Parish Council could fully deliver its statutory responsibilities without being part of these arrangements.

It was reported that the Parish Council was discussing public internet access with The Simpson Hall trustees.

**Our next meeting is on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March 2024 at 7.00pm. We hope to see you there.**



# Let's grow Potatoes!

Potatoes can be regarded as falling into one of two groups: "earlies" and "maincrop". The difference is essentially one of the time it takes for the potatoes to be ready to harvest (from nine weeks in the case of a "first early" but 12 - 14 for a "maincrop").

Within these two groups, different varieties have their biases: waxy salad potatoes ('new potatoes') like Charlotte, floury frying potatoes like Home Guard and big bakers like Nadine and Estima. For tasty novelties, try a 'blue' (purple skinned) potato or the strange knobbly tubers of the very waxy potato Pink Fir Apple. If this all sounds confusing, there is the tasty multipurpose potato, Kestrel.

Before they can be planted outdoors, seed potatoes should be 'chitted' or allowed to form sprouting shoots indoors, February is the time to get the 'earlies' started. Sit them (away from radiators) in the sections of an egg carton with the ends showing the most eyes (dormant buds) uppermost. They are ready to plant out when the shoots are about an inch (2.5cms) or so long.

Potatoes will thrive in a wide variety of soils. Dig in some garden compost and a little fish, blood and bone (but never manure). Plant the seed potatoes in shallow trenches about 5" (18cms) deep with the potatoes about a foot (30cms) apart for earlies and slightly more for maincrop plants, which are bigger.

Potato foliage is not frost hardy, so cover the shoots with extra soil if they begin to show above the surface when frosts threaten. As the plant grows larger, mound up more soil around the stems so that there is no risk of the uppermost potatoes catching the light and becoming green and poisonous.

Keep the plants well watered in dry summer weather to swell the potatoes and harvest 'earlies' as soon as the flowers open (or the buds drop instead) or they will become floury. To be on the safe side, carefully check that the tubers are the size of hen's eggs before digging up the whole plant.



## Parish magazine article February 2024

Ash Wednesday this year will fall on the 14th February which of course is also St Valentine's day! Ash Wednesday is traditionally the beginning of Lent and this has been marked over the years as a period of self-discipline, fasting and spiritual journeying. It is a period of penitence and self-examination and seeing ourselves from God's perspective. Even if we don't have a strong faith we have learnt through the work of Educational Neuroscientists that intentional self-reflection helps us to learn and enhances how we apply, transfer, retain and recall new ideas and information.

The bible recognises that as we go through life we will be tempted and tested and that our response to those times will help to shape the depth of our spiritual lives. I am often astounded by the way many Christians have been shaped by sermons and theology that promise good things but never talk about the cost of following Jesus. The writer and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer called this a theology of cheap grace.

"Cheap grace is the grace we bestow on ourselves. Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate."

Lent gives us an opportunity to realign our lives with God's values, it gives us a prolonged and focussed time to reflect and pray and to read the bible and deepen our faith. The 40-day period is time enough to build in new habits and actions into our lives, which will have a lasting effect.


With ongoing war in Ukraine, the conflict between Israel & Hamas and so much uncertainty in our world I am finding that there is a great deal of anxiety in society about the future and a sense of aimlessness and general anger and tiredness. Lent gives us as Christians an opportunity to give these feelings back to God and to ask him to heal and restore us. It is also, as Paul reminds us, a time to recognise that our human experiences are common and that whilst heightened by the personal challenges or world events, are not unique to us but the difference is that our faith will endure.

"No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to all. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it."

1 Corinthians 10:13

As Christians, whilst we can use this time for reflection, we also know how the story ends and we have an enduring hope within us because Jesus has conquered death and brought forgiveness to us. We are forever Easter people who live in the light of the resurrection and we can mark Lent because of his sacrifice for us. The rhythm of the spiritual and liturgical year is a helpful tool to remind us that there is a cost and a purpose to our faith, which is not about self-benefit and self-fulfilment but about generosity, servant heartedness and a simple humbler faith. As Christians, we have a message of hope for a better future and Lent gives us the perfect opportunity to prepare our hearts and minds to share the good news.
