Eucharistia

Many people have heard that In the Church the central feature of worship is to eat bread and drink wine (theological views aside). We call this a Eucharist service which is known in different traditions as a “Breaking of Bread”, “The Last Supper” or “Holy Communion” to mention the most common descriptions. The word, Eucharist, comes from a Greek word, “Eucharistia”. It means, “Thanksgiving”. So, more accurately, a “Communion” service is a service of “Thanksgiving”, rather than a service of eating and drinking. So why this word I ask myself?

The sentiment is rooted in an appreciation of being within the body of Christ known as the Church. Yet, it is broader in scope. I think the term is not just about what happens in a worship service but about a general attitude towards life and those who are with us in it. Being a Christian is about being grateful for what we have and warns us not to bemoan what we haven't. It's about being thankful for what we have, grateful for what God has given us, life and those we love. Whether inclined to God or not, I still think it is a helpful attitude, that should encourage us to dwell on what is good rather than what we see as not so good. A sign that we aren't being thankful I think is a tendency to blame God, other and the general state of things for what we haven't got. If we are doing that, we may be missing what we have and the glory of what life is offering.

This coming election on the 4th is a time to not get too despondent that who you voted for didn't win or to be too impatient and unrealistic about what a new parliament may bring. We should be realistic about what others can do for us as well as what we can do for ourselves. We shouldn't fix too much hope on the future at the expense of the present. Today is a day to be grateful for, tomorrow is something else. Whatever our hopes and dreams are for the future, we would do well to remain thankful, because it keeps us rooted in today, now and what we have, not what may or may not come. Let us be Eucharistia and stay thankful. It's a good way to live!

AN UNHOLY ALLIANCE

There is a system of food production such that two equally delicious cakes are up for grabs. One of them (A) is readily available but expensive. The other (B) is free at the point of delivery but you have to join a long queue and wait an awful long time to get a piece of it. I'm hungry with money to spare, so it's a 'no brainer' -- I happily pay up and eat my expensive cake. But hold on! What about those people who are just as hungry as me but cannot afford cake A. They have no choice but to join the queue for cake B, even though some of them are starving hungry and in danger of wasting away. Well, I feel bad about that but I can always put an ethical gloss on things: if I had joined the queue for cake B then those behind me would have waited even longer.

But while the logic here is impeccable, the consequences of one's actions are not the only ethical consideration at issue. The question remains as to what my real motives are. If I really don't care about those other people who have to queue then I can hardly claim any moral high ground. It might even be said that by the very act of buying my own piece of cake I am effectively sustaining, though not necessarily condoning, an unfair system of food production. For if all the resources had been channelled into the production of cake B then this particular moral dilemma might not have arisen.

And so the obvious parallel question arises: should we desist from using the NHS if we can afford to 'go private'? One answer here would be 'It all depends'. It depends on the condition of one's personal finances relative to the urgency of the medical assistance required. Some people are wealthy enough to pay for surgery and are glad of the opportunity to do so, maybe even claiming it as their right to do so. Still others, albeit a small minority, can well afford to use the private sector yet refuse to do so on principle -- principles political or ethical, or some combination of both. Thus, the ethical and practical complexities of the unholy alliance between privately funded medical care and NHS provision -- the system of so-called *national* health care which we currently enjoy or endure as the case may be, with the latter increasingly under pressure, seemingly to the point of breaking.

No easy answers here then. But at least we can hope for more to life than practicalities. As G.K.Chesterton once remarked: "Pragmatism is a matter of human needs, and one of the first of human needs is to be something more than a pragmatist."

Alan Gordon Blake, 92, BEM



We are delighted to announce that Alan, who raised £8333 for Burghill Church, has been awarded a BEM in the Kings Birthday Honours list, announced on June 15th, for services to the community in Hereford.

Alan was born and raised in Burghill and over his lifetime has raised vast sums of money for various charities. This began as a member of the Rotary club which he joined in 1968 and he is one of 6 Rotarians who collectively have raised over £400,000. He went on to raise

funds for No 1 Ledbury Road, Municipal charities and League of Friends. In October 2020, aged 88, inspired by Captain Sir Tom Moore he begun his notional 'Everest Climb' around the steep steps of his Hereford Garden. He climbed over 100,000 steps and in doing so raised nearly £25,000 for charity. This money was split equally between Burghill Church, Hereford Rotary club and Parkinsons disease. The later charity was chosen as his wife Val, who was also raised in Burghill, has suffered with this challenging disease for over 20 years.

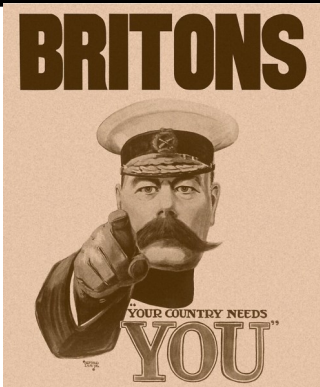

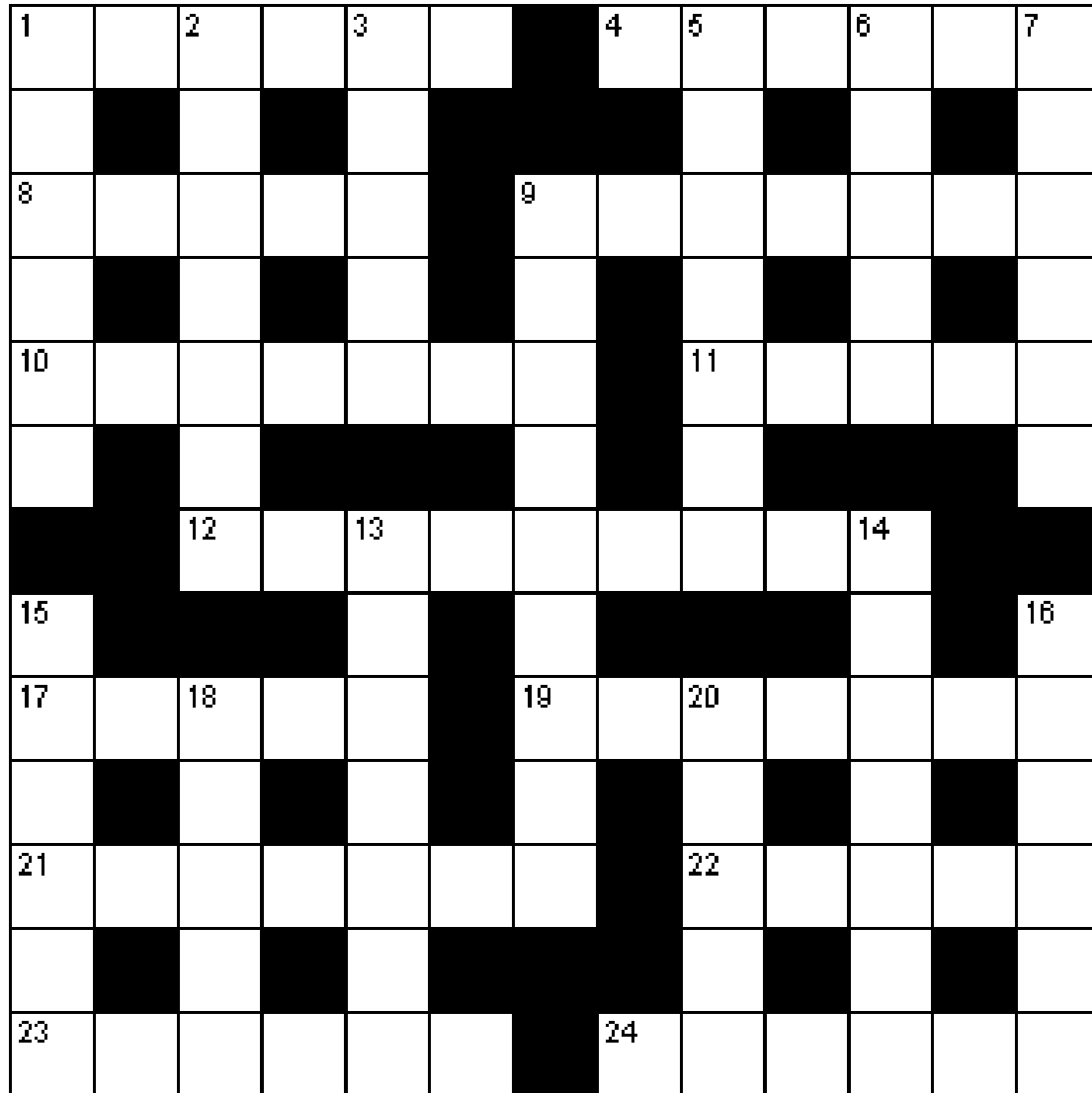

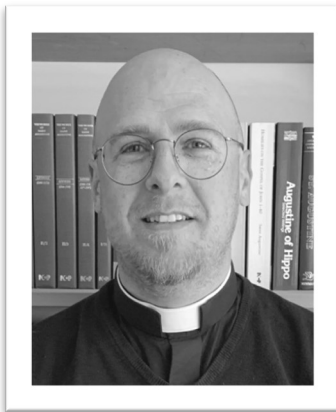
