# The Bible.

Now I know what you may be thinking that this is an article in which the Rector is going to shove his job down our throats. That is not my intention, but rather just to give you some perspective on what the Bible means to me. Now, to some of you it doesn't mean much, and everyone is entitled to their point of view. So what is mine?

Well, it's complicated and most things worth having are. So let me start with saying what I think the Bible isn't. I don't think that every answer to life is found therein, the Bible isn't a cure all for every dilemma, wisdom can be found anywhere and there are many great wisdoms found in various places and books. The Church has always recognised this, and it has always valued the treasures of western Philosophies in particular and knows that every path in life contains truth to varying degrees.

I don't think that the Bible is a book made up of chapters starting with genesis and ending in that rather mysterious book Revelation. It is rather a collection on a great variety of material written over many centuries in different places and aimed at different difficulties. The Bible is better described as a library.

I don't think the Bible is some great talisman that can be opened at random and used to tell us what to do with certain problems we are facing. There are many things I could go on to say, but what do I think it is?

I think the Bible is a great aid in discovering who God is and what He is really like. The best place to look is in the New Testament and to look at the person of Jesus. It is quite clear that in the Old Testament, they believed in a God who they did not know nor understand. As a result, they often got things wrong and in God's name did the thing that was the opposite of what they should have been doing. In many ways, I think the Old Testament, primarily is a story of human nature in the face of God first of all. It is a story of human beings failing to grasp the truth of the God who is with them. I think the New Testament and the person of Jesus specifically, is about rectifying that problem. Jesus leaves us in no doubt as to what God is like, because that is who he is.

You can look anywhere and find truth, but for me, only the Bible contains the whole truth about God and what He is like. There are of course many great truths not in the Bible, but when it comes to God, I think there is no better place to look.

## **Parish Council Small Grants Scheme**

Each financial year the Parish Council makes small grants available to organisations which support the local community. The process starts by local organisations being invited to submit their grant applications to the Parish Clerk by the end of September each year. If successful, an amount is then set aside within the following year's budget and paid in July. We would, therefore, invite local organisations to submit grant applications to the Parish Clerk [clerk@burghillparishcouncil.gov.uk](mailto:clerk@burghillparishcouncil.gov.uk) by the end of September this year. This will allow for the proposals to be considered and if they are successful, to ensure they are budgeted for. We will let organisation know the outcome of the process early next year. Any submitted proposals will be judged against the following criteria: What is the purpose of the grant request? Funding will only be granted to encourage beneficial activities and outcomes for the Parish and its environment.

- Will the grant be spent in the relevant financial year?
- Does the group or organisation have a constitution or set of rules and a safeguarding policy?
- Can the group or organisation provide a copy of its latest accounts / bank statement and does its bank account require a minimum of two signatories?
- Has the application been submitted in writing to the Clerk with sufficient information to enable the Parish Council to reach a decision?

## **David Apperley - A Life of Giving**

John and I were blessed to have enjoyed a wonderful and enduring friendship with David Apperley. I would even say that David and Audrey were our closest friends through much of our lives. A traditional and very 'British' chap, David had a delightful, mild Welsh accent, and an assuring, warm tone to his voice. He also had a surprisingly wicked sense of humor. He was a brilliant teacher and headmaster with an unerring ability to control an excitable class with a calm voice of authority and a headful of engaging stories and knowledge. A well known and highly respected primary school headmaster, even to this day,

David was responsible for creating exceptional schools in Burghill and later, at Holmer.

Through his teaching and leadership, “Mr Apperley”, as he was affectionately known, had a profound and positive influence on consecutive generations of young people. He shaped many young lives, both in their education and their general social and ethical attitude. His influence will always be remembered by many people across our county, both by former pupils and his work colleagues.

David’s other great passion in life was music. He had the rare ability to be able to perform a complex piece of church music or simply busk along at a village sing-along, as required. A talented and reliable organist and pianist at Burghill Church for many years, David was even generous enough to donate a church organ to Burghill Church. He was also an accomplished accordion player, and along with my husband John, performed at many local functions as well as the Hereford Accordion Club. David was Audrey’s right hand man, when it came to running the local Cub group and Sunday Club, always there to provide support and any musical input required! On many occasions, Audrey would simply ask him to play a spontaneous, unrehearsed song or piece of music, and David would instantly oblige. The onlooking children were always amazed at his ability to do this, which almost certainly, must have inspired many a young musical talent. Over several years, he had a crucial role in playing piano and arranging the music for the annual Scout and Guide Gang Show at Hereford Theatre. Some of you may also recall the highly entertaining concerts held at Burghill Scout and Guide Hut, featuring the legendary ‘Beet Bashers’; an evening of laughter and musical mayhem!

In addition to *teaching* children, David was also involved with an organisation called ‘International Help for Children’ (I.H.C.), a scheme that enabled children from poor backgrounds, from Austria and Germany, to visit and discover family life in the U.K. Little known to many, David was also a “ship builder”, having built and sailed his own Mirror sailing dinghy on Llangorse lake with Captain John Downes! David also had a passion for photography and filming, which enabled him to capture moments in time which would have otherwise been lost - from school trips and events, to social and community gatherings. He was a warm, reliable, and highly trusted friend to many of us, but above all else, he was a kind man. Our great friend David is now safely gathered up in God’s eternal love. Thank you David.

David had a very full life and played a major part in the life of Burghill and Tillington communities for over 50 years . He was a strong supporter of bell ringing . Rung to celebrate the life of David Apperley who died a month before his 94th birthday and whose funeral was today. David moved to Hereford as a young boy and was a Cathedral Chorister, a talented musician and briefly a towerbell ringer. He was a much loved teacher who eventually became headmaster of Burghill School and Holmer School and he was organist at Burghill church until his mid-80s always supporting the music and tower and handbell ringing at the church.



52 years ago David & I moved into "Woodbank", Tillington. We did wonder if we'd made the right decision as previously we had lived in town. We've never had one regret. We were welcomed with open arms. We have been very happy here & consider this village to be the best.

Since David's death I have been overwhelmed with kindness & love, with cards, phone messages, flowers, visits & prayers & more. They mean so much & have helped me a great deal. They are so appreciated.


## THE COMMUNITY PLANT STALL

## **Why not take a walk around Whitmoor Pool field?**

Whitmoor Pool Field is located next to Burghill Academy. The land is owned by Burghill Parish Council (BPC). It is accessible by a small gate located at the end of the layby that has been created for parking one or two cars. Please note the warning notice fixed to the gate by BPC. If you do go by bicycle the Council has provided some six bicycle storage racks for your use. The area nearest the road where the grass is maintained short has been allocated to Burghill in Bloom (BiB). This area is looked after by BiB team members. In this area daffodils, wild flowers, small shrubs have been planted. Two earth bank crescents have been created and in these various shrubs, sweet peas, daffodils bulbs, iris bulbs of various colours have been planted up. In one of the crescents two very large teasel plants have self-seeded themselves. Beyond the front area is the rest of the field that was covered with tall grass but just recently BPC has arranged for this to be cut down. Now the 40 plus small trees that were planted some two autumns ago have now taken root and are growing nicely. So why not take a walk around this facility provided for your use by BPC.
