Seeking Hope

This year is the five-year anniversary of the Covid pandemic, the 80th anniversary of the end of the second world war and more pointedly the year in which we remember the liberation of Auschwitz. For me, seeing those hostages released from Gaza and their Hamas captors parading those three men, was a stark image. Those emaciated soul was a shocking sight and an image of horror which arises from such hatred. For the world is a crucifying place for many, especially those who have been stripped of their humanity. We also see the signs of this within the Western world as certain leaders who have been elected thrive off the simmering resentments of their respective populations. Leaders who band about their power and ability to destroy this world in an instant and salivate at the prospect of control. These people simply exploit grievances rather than address them. So where is the hope in a seemingly hopeless world? St Paul tells us: "If with merely human hopes I fought with wild animals at Ephesus, what would I have gained by it? If the dead are not raised, 'Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die.'" (1 cor 15:32). In other words, the hope Paul speaks of is beyond this world and for that reason he has hope not just for himself, but for the whole world, because God made it.

Hope therefore is not something that is with us but rather something we have in front of us. For if we have it, it is no longer hope but rather something realised. Yet hope, is about the future, it is about the broader picture. I'll never forget what one Jewish lady said, that when she was a child, she was liberated from her camp on Easter Sunday. Though she was not a Christian, she took it as a sign that the God and His goodness was with her. That evil had been vanquished that day. Of course new days come with new challenges. Yet her eyes were opened to a greater thing beyond her situation. That feeling of liberation helped her build a new life, a life not contained or controlled by the past, because she found that goodness prevailed, and hope did not disappoint. As we travel through our own times, and particularly this Lent, let us not lose hope in the goodness of God and in the hope that Easter brings. Let us hold on to what is good and hope for higher things, for we lose nothing in hope and hope, in the end, will not disappoint.

Electoral Roll

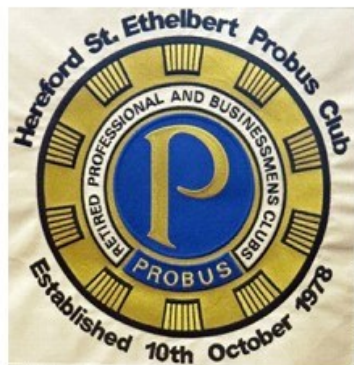
The Church Representation Rules require that every 6 years a new electoral roll is prepared – the last one was prepared in 2019 and so the new one is due in 2025.

PANCAKE DAY

“SHROVE TUESDAY”

Tue, 4 Mar 2025



Shrove Tuesday is a day of preparation for Lent, a 40-day period of fasting and prayer that precedes Easter. The name comes from the word "shrive," which means to confess sins and receive absolution.

Pancake Ingredients

You likely already have everything you need to make this pancake recipe. If not, here's what to add to your grocery list:

- **Flour:** This homemade pancake recipe starts with all-purpose flour.
- **Baking powder:** Baking powder, a leavener, is the secret to fluffy pancakes.
- **Sugar:** Just a tablespoon of white sugar is all you'll need for subtly sweet pancakes.
- **Salt:** A pinch of salt will enhance the overall flavor without making your pancakes taste salty.
- **Milk and butter:** Milk and butter add moisture and richness to the pancakes.
- **Egg:** A whole egg lends even more moisture. Plus, it helps bind the pancake batter together.

How to Make Pancakes From Scratch

It's not hard to make homemade pancakes — you just need a good recipe. That's where we come in! You'll find the step-by-step recipe below, but here's a brief overview of what you can expect:

1. Sift the dry ingredients together.
2. Make a well, then add the wet ingredients. Stir to combine.
3. Scoop the batter onto a hot griddle or pan.
4. Cook for two to three minutes, then flip.
5. Continue cooking until brown on both sides.

TOVE

Now there's a word for you. But surely, you say, there is no such word as tove! And as far as my *Concise Oxford* is concerned you would be right. There is no such word in the dictionary, and therefore, one might presume, no such thing exists either. But hold on! Just because 'tove' fails to appear in the dictionary it doesn't necessarily follow that there is no such thing as a tove; for all I know it might just be that nobody has yet come across one and bothered to name it. Dictionaries tell us which words are currently in circulation, which words are being used and what they mean, and what a word *means* -- assuming a single word can have *meaning* -- is whatever it points to or designates. Then again, since names don't appear in dictionaries, and any word, even a single letter, can be used as a name, perhaps 'Tove' (with a capital 'T') is a name too. And so it is, as Google informs me, that Tove (pronounced toe-vah) is a common Scandinavian name for a girl. I'm also reminded that some names have significance above and beyond whatever it is they designate. For Scandinavians, 'Tove' *means* beauty, even if Tove turns out to be ugly. And then of course there are the fictional names for non-existent things, but even here the names themselves are perfectly real and often totally affecting. There may still be lots of children, for example (not to mention adults) completely in awe of Lewis Carroll's "slithy toves" that "gyre and gimble in the wabe".

Now the very fact that I consult my dictionary, ask Alexa or Google, *means* that I am using words, whether printed or spoken, to verify the *meaning* of another word. Even our inner thoughts, our ideas, are conducted largely in terms of words. We don't *have* to say what we think, but in a real sense, in a distinctively human sense, our thoughts are what we say, even when we only speak inwardly to ourselves. And in the act of denying that something exists -- in virtue of the very act itself -- I cannot help but invoke the thing being denied. I claim there is no such thing as a Tove, for example, but in making this claim I create the idea 'Tove'. All of which brings us to Plato's great question: "Is the holy loved by the gods because it is holy, or is it holy because it is loved?" In concrete terms: Do I say this table is solid because it is solid, or is it solid because I say it is? In this sense, it looks as though I am locked into a circle of language, a circle from which there is no escape. On the other hand, there is no reason to think of this as a vicious circle. After all, entrapment within language is a necessary feature of the human condition, dangerous yes, but delightful too.

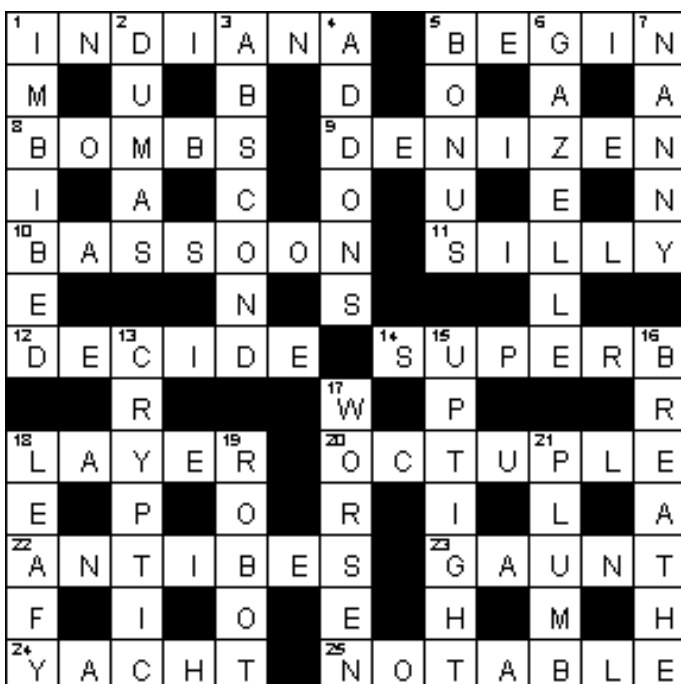
Spring, the sweet spring, is the year's pleasant king,

Cuckoo, jug-jug, pu-we, to-witta-woo!

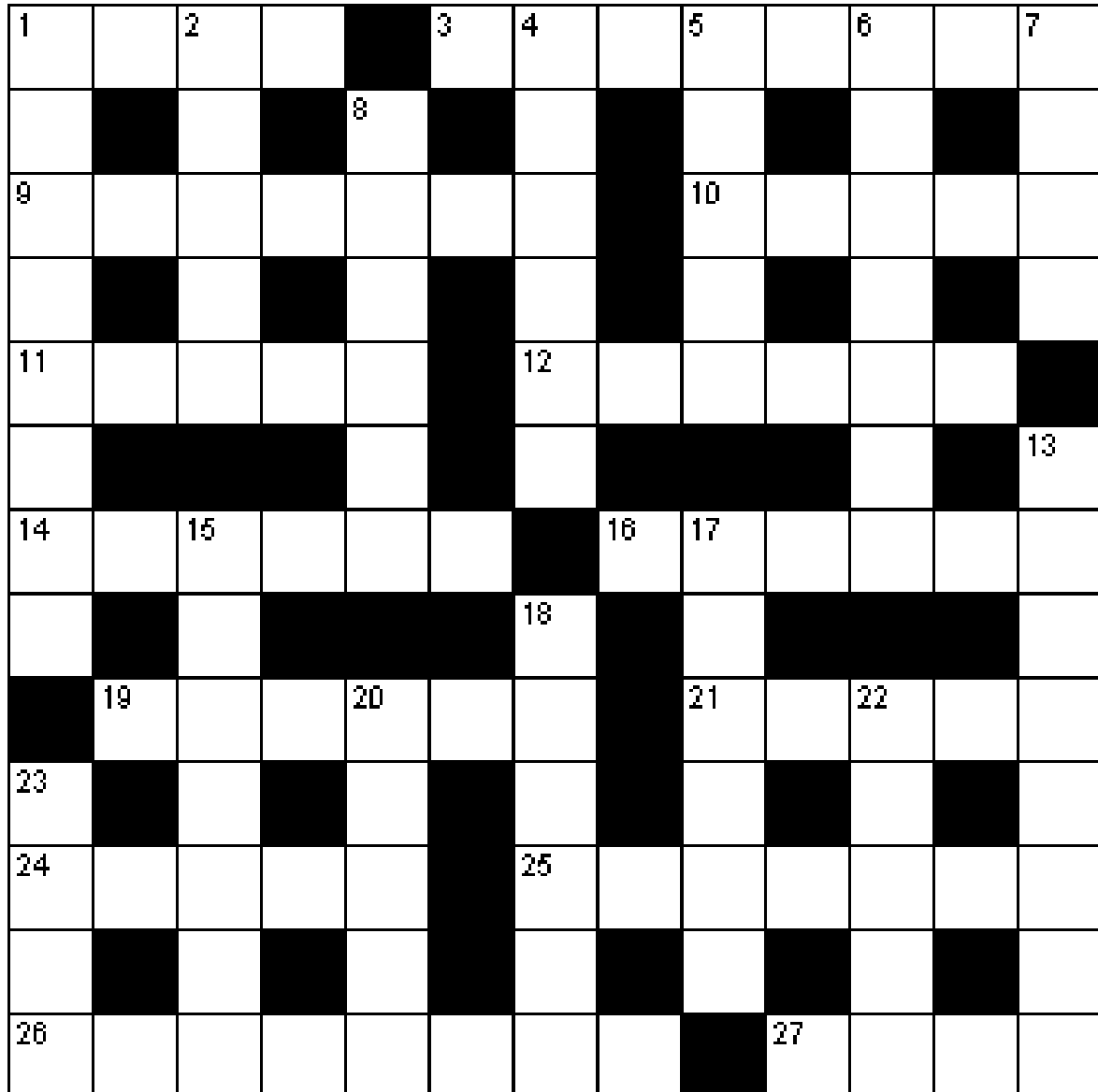
The fields breathe sweet, the daisies kiss our feet,

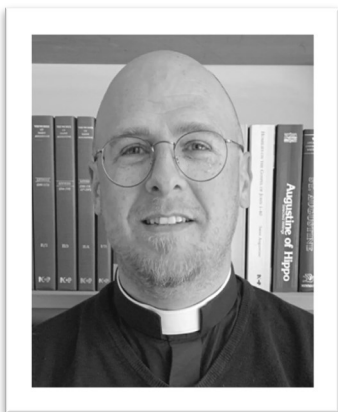
