# Doing What We Love

I was once told, 'If you do what you love for a living, you'll never work a day in your life'. I do think this is true, but sadly, most people probably don't. Most people end up in a job that pays and when things in your life happen, partner, children etc... you are where you are. This is largely because of the responsibilities that are placed on you. The world got itself in a big hurry and individuals disappeared into the crowded spaces. Identity lost, you could say. When this happens, the rate of dissociation dramatically rises and with it a great sense of alienation from others and even oneself. This way of life since that time has just gathered pace at a remarkable rate and now things change so fast that I can barely keep up with what is new. All the technology that we have I believe has ended up owning us rather than the other way around and we must be prepared to draw strict boundaries around our personal spaces. We are constantly invaded with this or that.

Personal space is key to a healthy life, and I urge you to guard it fiercely. But perhaps most importantly of all is to find something you love, something that you do for no other reason than you love it. Life only goes one way and our time is the most precious thing we have. Don't spend it all on things that you have to do but bring you no joy. Jesus said, 'Seek first the kingdom of God and everything else will be given to you'. In other words, seek the right things in life first and worry less about everything else. Do something you love and life will reward you.

# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Burghill Parish Council held its Annual Meeting on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> May. Nine Councillors were present along with six members of the public and our Ward Councillor, Pauline Crockett.

Alister Walshe was re-elected as Chair and Simon Hairshape was re-elected as Vice-Chair.

The Parish Council discussed four planning applications:

- 250889 - Woodfields Farm, Badnage Lane, Tillington, HR4 8LP. Proposed removal of condition 2 of the previous planning permission. The Parish Council recognised the difficulties that this condition is causing the applicant. The Parish Council is not in position to comment on whether the original condition was appropriate at the time but has no objection to it being removed.
- 250956 - 11 Haymeadow Lane, Burghill, HR4 7RZ. Extension and alterations. The Parish Council agreed to support this application.
- 251282 - 11 Chestnut Lane, Burghill, HR4 7QN. Proposed reductions to Chestnut tree. The Parish Council agreed to support this application.
- 250951 - Agricultural land at Tillington Fruit Farm, Tillington Farm, Burghill, HR4 7RW. Construction of an apple cold store with roof mounted solar panels, associated permeable hard standing, rainwater harvesting, loading and delivery areas, improved access track and soft landscaping. The Parish Council had no objections in principle but did have concerns regarding the scale of the building in a rural environment and the increased traffic flow and road safety in this area. The Parish Council agreed that conditions regarding hours of use, noise and lighting conditions should be imposed to protect local amenity.

The agreed traffic calming measures adjacent to the school were discussed. It is hoped that Herefordshire Council will implement these as soon as the school breaks up for the summer.

The financial position for the Council was discussed, the balance at 31<sup>st</sup> March was £30,193.94, which includes a reserve equivalent to one year's precept. The Parish Council's precept for 2025/2026 will generate a total income of £21,893. Annual costs are rising but we still have a

comfortable reserve in order to meet any unexpected additional expenditure. It was noted that precept increases have been kept to a minimum in recent years. The Council approved this years audit papers and accounts for 2024/2025.

The Parish Council has taken over the responsibility for the Talk Community Hub from the Good Neighbour Scheme. Some regular attendees are struggling with IT and it was decided to organise some Digital Awareness sessions as a valuable service to our community. A small grant of £120 was agreed to cover the costs of the Simpson Hall.

A new footpaths officer has been appointed, Steve Cameron and he introduced himself to the meeting and gave a brief outline of the walks he has currently carried out on the footpaths. He recently attended a footpaths officer session and can now log issues directly onto a local database with Herefordshire Council.

The Council has agreed to participate in the 2025/26 Lengthsman Scheme offered by Herefordshire Council. By joining this new scheme, the Parish Council will have the opportunity to apply for more grants related to minor road maintenance and drainage.

The Parish Council still has one vacancy, if anyone is interested, please contact the Clerk.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> July. We hope to see you there.

### **Parish Council Small Grants Scheme**

Over many years now the Parish Council has made small grants available to groups or organisations which support our local community. These grants are funded through the Council's budget. In a few months' time we will be starting the process of setting our budget for next year.

We would therefore, invite local groups or organisations to submit grant applications to the Parish Clerk [clerk@burghillparishcouncil.gov.uk](mailto:clerk@burghillparishcouncil.gov.uk) by the end of September this year. This will allow for the proposals to be considered and if they are successful, to ensure they are budgeted for. We will let applicants know the outcome of the process early next year.

Proposals will be judged against the following criteria:

Is the purpose of the grant request clear?

Will it be spent within the 2026/27 financial year?

Will it benefit the parish or its residents?

Does the group or organisation have a constitution or set of rules and a safeguarding policy?

Can the group or organisation provide a copy of its latest accounts / bank statement?

Does its bank account require a minimum of two signatories?

It is expected that groups and organisations will look at accessing different sources of funding for their project alongside any application to the Parish Council.

Please feel free to contact me if you wish to discuss a potential application.

### **The Annual Meeting for Burghill Parish was held on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> May.**

Alister Walshe (Chair) addressed the meeting.

“Thank you for attending this evening, I will start with a brief outline of the activities of the Parish Council over the last year.

Small Grants continue to be given to support the local community, providing funding for various groups and organisations. The Talk Community Hub continues to be co-ordinated by Janette Pudsey which proves to be popular with 30 plus people attending events. I would thank Joe and Joanna Helme for all their work on the Good Neighbour Scheme.

Tillington Common has had recent issues with trees which has now been resolved with the tree survey, the ditch has been cleared at the front of the common and we hope this will continue ease the issues which we had earlier in the year. The Commons Management Plan continues to be monitored on a regular basis. The Council has agreed to participate in Herefordshire Council’s ‘Lengthsman’ Scheme; by joining the Parish Council will have the opportunity to apply for more grants related to minor road maintenance and drainage. The agreed traffic calming measures adjacent to the school were discussed. It is hoped that Herefordshire Council will implement these as soon as the school breaks up for the summer.

A lease has been signed with the school, allowing them full access to part of Whitmoor Pool Common, for the children to use and develop their nature skills. We have appointed a new Footpaths Officer, Steve Cameron, who will monitor all the footpaths and report any issues to the Council via the Clerk. I would like to thank John Parnaby for his many years of service in this capacity. Throughout the year we have had many planning applications some that were contentious however, I believe that all councillors carried out full diligence on all applications in accordance with the relevant regulations. We continue to keep an eye on the ever-changing planning position and are very aware that our NDP will need updating in due course. Our precept was increased by one of the smallest amounts of any parish council this year and this has been a trend for many years now. This is due to sensible budgeting and managing of public finances by this Council, and I would like to thank the Chair of the Finance Working Group, Janette and fellow councillors for their diligence. I am aware that many councillors give their time to many other external organisations, this presence all helps this community and very much keeps the parish firmly on the map. I have very much enjoyed my year as your Chair, albeit find it frustrating at times at how slowly some things take to progress! I would like to thank our Ward Councillor Pauline Crockett for her support and my Vice Chair, Simon Hairsnape and Clerk, Paulette Scholes who have kept me on the right side of things, and to all my fellow councillors for their continued support and generous time given to our fantastic community".

Sally Robertson gave an update of The Copse and thanked the Parish Council for the donation they made towards the new play equipment now installed at The Copse. The income is mainly from donations, hiring out The Copse for various sporting activities and from fund raising events. Costs are for insurance, grounds maintenance, utilities and repairing furniture. The Copse Trust is looking to invest in some recycled containers to provide a kitchen, changing rooms and toilets for The Copse. They are currently replacing two benches, updating the woodland area and in the future are hoping to install tennis courts/MUGA and improve disability access.

Jason Himsworth from Balfour Beatty Living Places attended and gave an update on the local drainage following recent flooding. £1 million is available to spend on internal property flooding. A lot of drainage work is being carried out locally especially at the end of Tow Tree Lane. On-going issues with flooding at Whitmoor Pool Common and Crowmoor Lane are being looked at. He left a map for residents to mark where they are concerned with flooding, the Clerk will forward this onto Jason.

The Chair thanked local residents for attending.






# The Versatile Pebble Pool

One of the most popular, inexpensive and easy-to-set-up water features for the garden or patio, is the type generally known as the 'pebble pool'.

Making your own is easy, as it basically relies on one small electric water pump, a fountain attachment and a sump. The pump is placed underwater in a small sump below ground level. At ground level is a layer of sturdy, galvanised metal grille with holes small enough to hold medium sized pebbles without them dropping through, but which allows water to pass through freely. Poking up from the centre of this pebble layer is the fountain nozzle, usually set to make a gurgling geyser so that the water splashes neatly onto the pebbles with an attractive sound, passes between them, and returns back into the sump. Here the pump recycles the water and pumps it upwards again. A sunken oak half barrel lined with waterproof butyl rubber makes a good sump; however, small pebble pool kits - complete with pumps and holed plastic lids - can also be purchased ready to assemble. Just add pebbles and water.

The pebble pool has several advantages over the normal open-air type garden pool. Firstly, because the main bulk of the water is underground away from the light, the sump tends not to grow much green algae, as there is little light for it there.

The pump filter tends not to get clogged with debris either and hence the pebble pool is low maintenance by water feature standards.

Young children and small animals cannot fall into the water so it is a very safe option for those wanting to enjoy the sound of water without this risk.

The small size of the pebble pool also means that it can be slipped into the odd corner beside a patio or into the very smallest garden to suit the position of the electricity supply.

If it is not feasible to bury the sump in the ground, a pebble pool can be mounted above ground, for example up on a balcony. Here, the sides of the sump can be hidden (or given extra support if necessary) by small bags of sawdust or sand. Sand is sturdier but where weight is important, sawdust is a lighter alternative to consider. With some 'landscaping' with pot plants and wooden features, you'll be ready to relax on a summer's day to the soothing sound of water and allow the negative ions it gives off to invigorate you!
